MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT:

Happy Friday Willoughby Hills. I hope everyone was able to enjoy a little of the unseasonably warm weather this week as it looks like we are on the way back to colder temperatures for the next week to ten days. Things have been busy here in the City this week as I met with Council's Deer Management Committee on Wednesday evening and the Planning Commission/Architectural Board of Review's Master Plan Subcommittee met Thursday evening.

Councilwoman Belich chaired Wednesday night's Deer Management Subcommittee meeting where we discussed not only the City Administration's concerns regarding implementation of an archery hunting program to assist in managing our significant deer population, but also that the Subcommittee will be working to disseminate information to our residents about other ways to help protect their property (and particularly their gardens) from the deer. Keep an eye out for this information both in future newsletters and on the City's Website and Facebook page.

On Thursday evening, the Master Plan Subcommittee met with David Radachy, the Director of the Lake County Planning and Community Development Department. The Master Plan is now in its final stages and will be submitted to the Subcommittee to be approved and sent to City Council on February 2nd.

I would like to thank Dave and his colleague Alanna Ciancibello for their assistance to the PC-ABR during this process as well as the Committee consisting of Chairman Tom Elliott, Vice Chairman Dan Biondolillo, John Lillich, Tom Roseum, Ron Lewis, Frank Cihula and Council Representative Tanya Taylor Draper for their hard work over the last 2 years. The group went above and beyond to meet with residents, developers, business owners, the Metroparks and many others to gather the necessary information and then work with Dave and Alanna to create the Master Plan.

Finally, many residents have been discussing the recent thefts of Kia and Hyundai automobiles in the area. The Police Department is attempting to obtain steering wheel locks from Kia and Hyundai for distribution to residents in the same manner as some of our nearby communities. If we can obtain them from Kia or Hyundai, we will distribute them to residents as soon as possible. In the meantime, Both Kia and Hyundai have been providing wheel locks to qualified customers. Please keep in mind that Cleveland Metroparks will be continuing their deer management program this winter to establish and maintain a balanced ecosystem. From noon to 6:00 a.m. the following morning, portions or all of North Chagrin Reservation will be closed to the public on several days from now through March 16th, 2023.

Specific closures will be posted on <u>Cleveland Metroparks Alerts and Closures</u> page by 6 p.m. on the evening prior to an area's closure. This announcement will give details about reservations and sections of the parkway that will be closed between noon and 6 a.m. the following morning.

COUNCIL NEWS

The Deer Management Subcommittee met Wednesday evening. The meeting agenda and audio have both been posted <u>here</u>. Discussed was the desire to provide education on more natural ways to manage the deer population. Here area few non-lethal ways to manage deer on your property:

- Do not feed the deer.
- Select deer-averse plants.
- Chemical Deer Repellents (Deer Away/Big Game Repellent, Liquid Fence, Thiram, Magic Circle, Dr. T's Deer Blocker Hinder, Millers' Hot Sauce)
- Homemade Deer Repellents (2 handfuls of human hair in a mesh bag, worn clothes with human odor hung near plants, predator urine sprinkled on ground or cloths around plants, rotten eggs placed in vicinity of plants, blood meal or bone meal scattered around plants on ground, and soap shavings scattered on ground around plants or a bar of soap hung from plants by a string).
