O'DONNELL ADMINISTERED THE OATHS OF OFFICE TO COUNCILWOMAN JULIE BELICH, COUNCILWOMAN VICKI MILLER, COUNCILMAN JOE JARMUSZKIEWICZ AND COUNCILMAN DAN KNECHT. THEY ARE COMMITTED TO WORKING FOR THE BETTERMENT OF OUR COMMUNITY, ALONG WITH COUNCIL PRESIDENT CHRIS HALLUM, COUNCIL VICE PRESIDENT MIKE KLINE AND COUNCILWOMAN TANYA TAYLOR DRAPER. RESIDENT CONCERNS TO MAYOR'S OFFICE THIS WEEK:

JUST WANTED TO SHARE A FEW THINGS THAT HAPPENED IN OUR COMMUNITY THAT PROMPTED RESIDENTS TO CALL THE MAYOR'S OFFICE FOR ADVICE/RESOLUTION THIS WEEK:

1. WHY DID THE POWER GO OUT ON WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 5?

AT ABOUT 2:30 P.M., CALLS WERE RECEIVED ABOUT POWER OUTAGES ON RIVER ROAD AND RIVER'S EDGE. THE POWER WAS RESTORED AT APPROXIMATELY 6:30 P.M.
FIRSTENERGY REPRESENTATIVE WENDY ZELE WAS CONTACTED AFTER THE FIRST CALL CAME IN TO CITY HALL. THE CITY WAS ADVISED THAT 89 CUSTOMER WERE IMPACTED BY THE OUTAGE. THERE WAS A WINDSTORM, A TREE HAD COME DOWN IN THE AREA OF 2366 RIVER ROAD AND BROUGHT A PRIMARY WIRE DOWN. CREWS WERE DISPATCHED IMMEDIATELY AND THE EVENT WAS RESOLVED IN APPROXIMATELY FOUR HOURS.

THE MAYOR'S OFFICE WAS PLEASED THAT THE RESIDENTS MADE THE FIRST CALL TO FIRSTENERGY TO REPORT THE OUTAGE AT 1-888-544-4877. THAT HELPED EXPEDITE THINGS! THANK YOU!

2. WHY WAS A SMALL TRUCK USED ON WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 5, TO PICK UP THE TRASH ROUTE ON HEMLOCK?

THE MAYOR'S OFFICE HAD RECEIVED A CALL FROM A HEMLOCK RESIDENT WHO STATED HIS TRASH HAD NOT YET BEEN PICKED UP. A CALL TO REPUBLIC SERVICES BY THE MAYOR'S OFFICE REPORTED THE HEMLOCK ISSUE; HOWEVER, THE REGULAR DRIVER ON THE ROUTE HAD ALREADY PROBLEM SOLVED TO TAKE CARE OF THIS ISSUE. AS IT TURNS OUT, THERE WAS A LOW-HANGING WIRE ON HEMLOCK WHICH PREVENTED THE LARGE GARBAGE TRUCK FROM GOING DOING THE STREET SAFELY. THE DRIVER THEN RETURNED TO THE REPUBLIC FACILITY TO COMPLETE THIS STREET WITH A SMALL TRUCK. THERE WERE CONCERNS ABOUT "GARBAGE FLYING ALL OVER" HOWEVER, ROAD SUPERINTENDENT GRUBISS SURVEYED THE AREA AND FOUND NOTHING LEFT BY THE REPUBLIC DRIVER.

SNOW WATCH....

AS WE PREPARE FOR THE PREDICTED SNOW STORM OVER THE NEXT FEW DAYS, JUST A FEW REMINDERS TO OUR RESIDENTS:

DRIVE SAFELY!! TAKE YOUR TIME TO GET WHERE YOU NEED TO GO.

PRACTICE SNOW SHOVELLING COURTESY...DO NOT PLOW YOUR SNOW INTO YOUR NEIGHBOR'S DITCH OR YARD. DO NOT PILE THE SNOW SO HIGH THAT YOU CANNOT SEE OVER IT AS YOU ENTER OR LEAVE YOUR DRIVEWAY. KEEP YOUR DRIVEWAY CLEAN AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE FOR POLICE, FIRE OR DELIVERY DRIVERS.

MAKE YOUR HOME WARMER WITH THESE WINTERIZING TIPS -

Provided by Fair Housing Resource Center (FHRC):

- 1. CHANGE YOUR FURNACE FILTER.
- 2. ELIMINATE DOOR DRAFTS.
- 3. SEAL ALL OUTLETS.
- 4. INSULATE WINDOWS.
- 5. WEATHER STRIP YOUR DOORS AND WINDOWS.
- 6. REMOVE OR TARP WINDOW AIR CONDITIONERS.
- 7. CHANGE THE DIRECTION OF CEILING FANS (If the air in your home feels hot and trapped, you can simply reverse the ceiling fans to push the warm air back down. Don't worry, it won't add a breeze! This simple trick can save you 10% on your heating bill.)
- 8. Control your thermostat. (Set your thermostat lower when you go to bed or work. Turning down your thermostat 10 degrees for eight hours a day can save around 10% on your energy bill. You can also purchase a programmable thermostat to do the work for you.)
- 9. Seal up any holes in exterior walls.
- 10. Use heavy drapes and area rugs.
