MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT:

This week's word is "strength." I have witnessed the strength of our City departments as they practiced emergency preparedness while waiting for the impending flooding to occur in our City. Our Service Department prepared with barriers and road closure signs and kept a constant eye on the rising Chagrin River, along with the Fire Department, who prepared for the Red Cross to be available in the event that residents needs to be evacuated to the Community Center or other places to seek shelter. The Police Department was on constant patrol, to assist of any resident who may flag them down for assistance if water started to flood their homes and properties. Our Administrative staff took many resident calls with questions and concerns about emergency preparedness concerns and their patience never waned. Finally, I saw the strength of our residents, who, no matter how tough the situation was, they were determined to be prepared, methodically planning for the worst-case scenario. The careful planning and strength, I believe, is what got us through the last few days when truly the weather could have been much worse and much more devastating to our City. So thank you all for the strength you showed to get us through the storm. It is greatly appreciated.

Now that we know that the warmer weather is coming, it is a reminder of our Annual Pancake Breakfast. We are all set to go with the breakfasts on Sunday, March 6 and Sunday, March 13, with "to go" orders available both days. - Black Cat Ball: October 27 at Tall Oaks Event Complex in Kirtland



POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE:

From Police Chief Matt Naegele

The Police Department has experienced a recent increase in both vehicle break-ins and vehicle thefts. Each stolen vehicle incident involved cars being unlocked and keys left inside. The same held true for the break-ins; the doors were left unlocked. Here are some helpful tips that may serve as a reminder to stay vigilant in protecting your property.

- Lock your doors every time you leave your vehicle. A vast majority of vehicles that are burglarized have been vehicles that were unlocked. Lock your car doors!
- Do not leave your car running unattended even for a minute; criminals are opportunists who love an easy job.
- Do not leave valuable or even cheap items in plain sight. Offenders often look into a vehicle to see if it is worth breaking into. What you think is worthless, they may see as some value to them.
- Car alarms are a deterrent they are loud and annoying. However, next time this happens, take notice that there are no car thieves around that noisy car.
- Do not park your vehicle in an isolated area or an area where others cannot see your vehicle from the street.
- If you park in your garage make, sure you lock your garage door. If you are gone for a while do not leave your garage door opener inside your vehicle especially in plain sight. This could potentially give them access to not only your vehicle but also your entire residence.
- Call 911 anytime you see someone or something suspicious in the area. It is always better to be safe rather than sorry. The Willoughby Hills Police Department responds to all calls for service and take all suspicious activity alerts very seriously.

Friends of Euclid Creek Announces 2022 Environmental Studies Scholarship

South Euclid, OH, Jan. 10, 2022 - The Friends of Euclid Creek (FOEC), a grassroots, non-profit organization advocating for the health of the Euclid Creek watershed, is pleased to announce the availability of its 2022 annual scholarship in environmental studies. This scholarship aids one deserving student in his/her pursuit of a degree or certificate in environmental studies, field biology, or any scientific field related to watershed health.

FOEC is currently seeking applications from high school seniors or college students who are interested in studying within the fields of environmental science. A one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) scholarship - earmarked for educational purposes – will be awarded. There may be a second scholarship of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) also. The Friends of Euclid Creek Board of Directors approves all awards.

Applicants must not have received a previous scholarship from the Friends of Euclid Creek. Applicant evaluation is based on background and potential to contribute to environmental studies.

Interested students must submit a one to two-page letter describing their career goals, past volunteer work related to environmental studies, and significant achievements to date. Applicants also must provide a minimum of one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, or community member. Applicants must also provide contact information as explained at https://www.friendsofeuclidcreek.com/scholarship.

All application materials must be postmarked on or before April 1, 2022. Mail applications to the Friends of Euclid Creek, P.O. Box 21384, South Euclid, Ohio 44121. Emailing applications is also permitted. Applicants must be willing to complete an interview with FOEC members, upon request, and release information and photos about winning the scholarship.

FIRSTENERGY REFUND INFORMATION:

Ohio Consumers' Council & NOPEC Advocate for Record \$306m In Consumer Refunds:

Consumer advocacy by the Ohio Consumers' Counsel (OCC) and the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council (NOPEC) led to a historic settlement at the PUCO resulting in FirstEnergy refunding \$306 million in "significantly excessive" profits to 2.1 million customers. The first installment of the refunds, averaging \$26.91 for residential customers, appear as bill credits on this month's Cleveland Electric Illuminating, Ohio Edison and Toledo Edison bills. Non-residential customers received \$2.68 per mWh. The remainder of the refund will be paid out to customers as credits on their electric bills over the next five years. The average FirstEnergy residential customer will receive a total of \$85.71 paid in installments as follows:

- **\$1.87 per month (\$22.44 annually)** per consumer (for \$80 million in total will be credited in 2022, through a monthly bill credit).
- **\$1.40 per month (\$16.80 annually)** per consumer (for \$60 million in total will be credited in 2023, through a monthly bill credit).
- **\$1.05 per month (\$12.60 annually)** per consumer (for \$45 million in total will be credited in 2024, through a monthly bill credit).
- \cdot \$0.58 per month (\$6.96 annually) per consumer (for \$25 million in total will be credited in 2025, through a monthly bill credit).

The settlement involves profits cases under a 2008 utility ratemaking law known as Senate Bill 221, which requires refunds of charges for "significantly excessive" utility profits. Previously the most any electric utility was required to refund to consumers for "significantly excessive" profits was \$43 million from AEP Ohio about a decade ago. The 2008 law limits electric utility refunds to "significantly excessive" profits and allows electric utilities to keep excessive profits.

"Today's record refund is the culmination of OCC's hard-fought efforts over several years to secure refunds for consumers regarding FirstEnergy's high profits," said Ohio Consumers' Counsel Bruce Weston. "Last year, in an OCC appeal, the Ohio Supreme Court threw out a PUCO decision shielding FirstEnergy from refunding profits. Consumers are to get \$306 million of justice. We hope it's a trend," Weston added.


