On Tuesday, March 8, at 8:00 a.m. at Normandy Party Center in Wickliffe, I will present the "State of the Cities" which is sponsored by the Willoughby Western Lake County Chamber of Commerce. Special thanks to Executive Director Karen Tercek for allowing me and the other area mayors to speak briefly on our communities. I will share my thoughts with you in the next E-newsletter but I plan to deliver a very positive message for the City of Willoughby Hills.

As we prepare to turn our clocks ahead on Sunday, March 13, 2022, at 2:00 a.m., it is a reminder to check our smoke detectors and begin to think about spring safety. With that in mind, I have asked Fire Chief Gandee to prepare an article for our next newsletter which will outline such items as spring severe weather safety, avoiding downed power wires, careless smoking and wild fires. With Republic Services yard waste benefit beginning again on April 1, it is a great time (as weather permits) to start gathering those twigs and branches and prepare for our long-awaited spring. I continually check out the long-term weather predictions as my office would like to plan for an "Earth Day" clean up around our City, with a focus on some of our businesses who may need a hand to get rid of litter when their staffing has been reduced.
