EDDY ROAD CLOSURE BEGINNING ON MARCH 1, 2021

Willoughby Hills City Engineer DiFranco has notified the City of Ohio Department of Transportation's (ODOT) plans to close Eddy Road (weather permitting) on March 1, 2021, to begin work on the deck replacement for Eddy Road bridge over I-271.

Traffic will be detoured via Chardon Road between Bishop and SR-91 while this closure is in place. The road will be closed for approximately 240 days, or an anticipated opening date of October 27, 2021. "Local Traffic Only" Signs will be placed at Bishop and Eddy Road, as well as Bishop and SOM Center (SR-91).

NEWS FROM MAYOR GARDNER'S OFFICE:

CHANGES COMING TO THE 440 AREA CODE: TEN DIGIT DIALING BEGINS ON APRIL 24, 2021 & WILL BE MANDATORY BY OCTOBER 24, 2021!

THE CITY HAS BEEN MADE AWARE OF A NEW POLICY THAT WILL AFFECT OUR PERSONAL PHONES, EMERGENCY CONTACT NUMBERS, AND OTHER ASPECTS WHEN DIALING ANY NUMBER IN THE 440 AREA CODE.

THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION (FCC) HAS ADOPTED "988" AS A NEW THREE-DIGIT NUMBER TO BE USED NATIONWIDE TO REACH THE NATIONAL SUICIDE PREVENTION & MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS LIFELINE, STARTING JULY 16, 2022. IN ORDER FOR "988" TO WORK IN CERTAIN AREA CODES, 10-DIGIT LOCAL DIALING MUST FIRST BE IMPLEMENTED. THE 440 AREA CODE HERE IN OHIO HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS ONE OF THE TWO AREA CODES WHERE YOU WILL NEED TO CHANGE THE WAY YOU DIAL LOCAL CALLS.

WHAT WILL BE THE NEW DIALING PROCEDURE?

TO COMPLETE ALL LOCAL CALLS, YOU WILL NOW NEED TO DIAL AREA CODE + TELEPHONE NUMBER. THIS APPLIES TO ALL CALLS WITHIN OUR 440 AREA CODE THAT ARE CURRENTLY DIALED WITH SEVEN DIGITS.

WHEN WILL THE CHANGE BEGIN?

BEGINNING APRIL 24, 2021, YOU SHOULD BEGIN DIALING 10 DIGITS (AREA CODE + TELEPHONE NUMBER) FOR ALL LOCAL CALLS. IF YOU FORGET AND DIAL JUST 7 DIGITS, YOUR CALL WILL STILL BE COMPLETED.
BEGINNING OCTOBER 24, 2021, YOU MUST DIAL 10-DIGITS (AREA CODE + TELEPHONE NUMBER) FOR ALL LOCAL CALLS. ON & AFTER THIS DATE, LOCAL CALLS WITH ONLY 7 DIGITS MAY NOT BE COMPLETED AND A RECORDING WILL INFORM YOU THAT YOUR CALL CANNOT BE COMPLETED AS DIALED!

NEW INFORMATION REGARDING REGISTRATION FOR COVID VACCINE:

How do I get an appointment?

On Friday mornings, vaccine appointments for the following week will be available in ArmorVax. Notice of available appointments will also be posted on the Lake County General Health District website (www.lcghd.org) on LCGHD's Facebook and Twitter accounts, and announced via LCGHD's weekly Situation Report. Lake County residents who currently qualify to receive the COVID-19 vaccine should create an account with the ArmorVax scheduling system by visiting www.armorvax.com. Once an account is created, eligible users will be able to search for available vaccine appointments.

- Important tips for creating an ArmorVax account include the following:
- Use a unique email address for each person creating an account.
- Be certain to select your eligible occupation and/or condition when creating account.
- You must first answer the screening questions before you will be able to schedule an appointment time.
- Do not attempt to create an ArmorVax account until your eligibility is announced you will not be able to schedule an appointment.
- Individual identification and proof of occupation is required for all vaccine appts.

Those without email addresses, and/or needing assistance with making appointments may call (440) 350-2684 on Mondays and Tuesdays, between from 8 am to 4:30 pm.

What if I was already signed up on the 1A or 1B scheduling list?

Residents who have previously signed up for the scheduling list are encouraged to create an ArmorVax account, following the directions above. LCGHD will continue to notify you of available clinic opportunities.

What type of vaccine will I receive?

The vaccine type available (Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson) varies by provider. LCGHD & Lake Health clinics will administer whichever vaccine is available.

MORE COVID VACCINE INFORMATION:

To support the response, Lake County is also utilizing the WENS system which has the ability to send out text notifications to update residents about important changes to the LCGHD's COVID-19 Vaccine website, https://www.lcghd.org/2019-novel-coronavirus-ncov/covid-19-vaccination. This system will be one of several resources available for residents to have easy access to the most up-to-date information. Residents are invited to text the keyword LAKEOHVAX to 69310 to sign-up to receive messages from the WENS system. This is an optional service, and residents do not need to sign up for this service to be receive notifications when vaccine is available.

Beginning January 14, a statewide vaccine provider search is available at <u>coronavirus.ohio.gov/vaccine</u>. This search feature will identify vaccine providers in each Ohio county, as well as the number of doses allocated to each location. Residents are encouraged to check both websites frequently as information continues to develop.

POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS FROM CHIEF NAEGELE:

It's getting close to that time of year when WHPD begins receiving reports of black bear and coyote sightings. Although this raises concerns for some, there is no immediate cause for alarm, as both species are completely normal for this area of Ohio. With that said, the Ohio Department of Natural Resources is a great reference for education on both species (ohiodnr.gov). Below are some helpful tips in the event you spot or come into contact with one of these animals:

Black Bear

Black bears are usually afraid of people and bear attacks are extremely rare. If you happen to see a black bear remain calm. The ODNR Division of Wildlife recommends the AWARE method if you come in contact with a bear.

Act calm and do not run.

Warn the bear that you are near; talk in a firm, calm voice.

Allow space between you and the bear. Step aside and back slowly away. Do not make the bear feel trapped or threatened.

Raise your hands above your head to appear larger if the bear approaches. Clap your hands or shout to scare the bear away.

Exit the area.

Once you have safely exited the area call 1-800-WILDLIFE (945-3543) or use the ODNR website to report the sighting. This will help to track the locations of the black bears and help to estimate the population in Ohio.

Coyote

Understand that coyotes are common throughout Ohio's 88 counties in both rural and urban settings. There are no wild wolves living in Ohio.

Identify that the canine is truly a coyote and not a stray dog. If you determine the animal is a stray dog, contact your county dog warden.

If you do have a coyote on your property, remove all "attractants" to possibly deter the coyote from returning. This includes removing garbage and pet food before nightfall and cleaning up around the grill.

Coyotes prey primarily on small mammals, such as rabbits and mice. Small pets may also be taken. Keep small dogs and cats inside. Coyotes are curious, but generally fearful of humans. Clap your hands and shout in a stern voice to scare off coyotes that are investigating your yard.
