On Tuesday, March 8, at 8:00 a.m. at Normandy Party Center in Wickliffe, I presented the State of the City address at the event, sponsored by Willoughby Western Lake County Chamber of Commerce. I highlighted the new businesses (Zoom Car Wash and the upcoming Cleveland Animal Rehab facility), along with six new businesses making their way through the planning process, to include a type of "Door Dash" facility. (More info to follow as these are solidified). I spoke of the good year we had last year with the ability to purchase vehicles and equipment earlier than expected with federal funding amidst the threat of supply shortages. I highlighted the work, particularly around the holidays, to help those in need with food, toy and blanket drives, and even adding a bit of cheer with the holiday parade and the Grinchmobile. With only eight minutes to speak, the time seemed to go by very fast and I certainly could not include everything, but I believe that the City was portrayed in a positive light and certainly heading in the right direction as we begin to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.

As we prepare to turn our clocks ahead on Sunday, March 13, 2022, at 2:00 a.m., it is a reminder to check our smoke detectors and begin to think about spring safety. With that in mind, I have asked Fire Chief Gandee to prepare an article in an upcoming newsletter which will outline such items as spring severe weather safety, avoiding downed power wires, careless smoking and wild fires. With Republic Services yard waste benefit beginning again on April 1, it is a great time (as weather permits) to start gathering those twigs and branches and prepare for our long-awaited spring. I continually check out the long-term weather predictions as my office would like to plan for an "Earth Day" clean up around our City, with a focus on some of our businesses who may need a hand to get rid of litter when their staffing has been reduced. Earth day is April 22, but we may decide to gather before then if the weather cooperates. After that, of course, we will be looking for interested volunteers to complete our project. I am confident that many of our fine residents will step up to help beautify our community.

We are all set to go with the our second and final breakfast on Sunday, March 13 from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. with "to go" orders available. The breakfasts will be served at Willoughby Hills Community Center, 35400 Chardon Road, Willoughby Hills. Pre-sale tickets for this event are \$7 for adults and \$4 for children ages 5-12. Children 4 and under are free. Tickets are \$1 more if purchased at the door. Volunteers are welcome too! Hope to see you there!

The City is currently working with the City of Willoughby and the Lake County West End YMCA for pool rates this summer. In the meantime, however, many residents have pools in their yards who may be starting to think about filling the pool to get it ready for the season. In the past, these residents may have filled their pool from their garden hose, which resulted in an increase in their water and sewer bill. The City has reached out to Lloyd's Water Service in Kirtland to provide the service to fill the pools for a set fee of \$250 per load (up to 4,000 gallons). This may be a savings, compared to what residents pay on their water/sewer bill through Lake County Department of Utilities. If this is a good option for you, please feel free to reach out to Lloyd's Water Service at 440-256-1509. There may certainly be other water companies available to do this service and Lloyd's Water Service is just one that you can consider as an option to filling your pool with your garden hose.

WILLOUGHBY HILLS PD ANNOUNCES "SCRAM" PROGRAM:

The Willoughby Hills Police Department Surveillance Camera Registration & Mapping (SCRAM) Program provides an opportunity for residents and business owners to help officers solve local crimes with the help of video surveillance cameras. With the popular use of surveillance systems in communities, video evidence has frequently helped officers develop leads and conclude investigation.

Participation is voluntary. Here is how it works: Using the geographic location of registered cameras, officers from WHPD will be able to directly contact a registrant to determine if they have helpful recordings, should a crime occur near the registered surveillance system. Registration: To register your exterior video security system, please complete the form at the end

of this E-newsletter and return it by email or by regular mail, as directed on the form. Disclaimer & Terms of Use: Registration is voluntary. Registration information will be used by the WHPD only for official purposes. Any footage containing or related to criminal activity may be collected by WHPD for use as evidence during any state of a criminal proceeding. Under no circumstances should registrants construe they are acting as an agent or employee of the City of Willoughby Hills or WHPD. If you wish to withdraw from the program, contact WHPD. 
TRIVIA NIGHT - PREPARED FOR TUESDAY, MARCH 15....
