MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT:

Council has announced a change in dates of their District meetings (which are noted in this E-newsletter). I encourage our residents to review the Police Departments SCRAM Program, which stands for Surveillance Camera Registration and Mapping. Once a resident or business registers their home or business security camera, the Police Department is then able to use the video to assist in a crime that may occur in the area. With the recent car break-ins in our City, it would be nice to let the criminals know that they are on camera if they come through Willoughby Hills. As a reminder to all residents, however, your best course of action to prevent the car break-in is to lock your vehicle at all times. It appears that the thieves are just looking for an easy way to grab cash and valuables by entering an unlocked car. Fire Hydrant Flushing News:

The Lake County Department of Utilities will be conducting unidirectional fire hydrant flushing in the cities Wickliffe and Willoughby Hills. The areas to be flushed in Wickliffe will be on Rt. 84 to Rt. 90 & Rockefeller & Rt. 84 South to Nehls Park Dr. In Willoughby Hills flushing will be Rt. 91 south to White Rd and Eddy Rd, Rt.6 east to River Rd and all adjacent streets. Flushing will begin on 4/04/22 and continue through the 5/27/22. Signs will be posted in the areas that are to be flushed. Please refer to our website in the public announcement section for areas to be flushed and schedule updates.

ROCK N ROLL DAY IN WILLOUGHBY HILLS....MEETING UPDATE:

A meeting was held on Tuesday, March 29 at 6:00 p.m. in the Community Center to discuss plans for the City's Rock N Roll Day in Willoughby Hills set for Saturday, August 13, 2022 from 10am to 10pm.

The group reviewed the draft program of events, all related to the theme of Rock N Roll. The bands (Sumrada and Ricky N the Rockets) are booked to perform on stage in the tents on the Roemisch ball fields, where there will also be a tent for attendees to sit and enjoy the music and food. The gazebo will be occupied for the day by our DJ (and emcee for the event), who will start at 10:00 a.m. with a special tribute to the late former Willoughby Hills resident and Rock N Roll icon, Michael Stanley. We talked about the hope to bring in the late musician's family to say a few words before the dedication of a huge memorabilia showcase will be presented and which will remain in the Community Center to honor his memory for years to come. Once the dedication is complete, we will move into kids' games in that area, featuring such things as coloring contest, musical chairs, Rock N Roll Bingo, corn hole, lucky wheel game, and more. These game ideas will be left to the discretion of the group (hopefully Willoughby Hills Recreation Commission) to take on this role. They will then be able to reach out to other groups (such as National Honor Society, AFS, Key Club or residents who would be willing to volunteer a few hours for the day).

The group discussed memorabilia to be housed within the Community Center, along with a basket raffle and a souvenir stand where attendees can bring home some great memories. We will also reach out to some local authors who may be interested in coming to sign and sell their books related to Rock N Roll. Jan Brody brought up the name "Janice Mitchell" who wrote a book called "My Ticket to Ride" which tells her story as a fifteen-year-old girl who hopped a plane with her girlfriend in the 1960's to go see a Beatles concert. (Surprised she lived to tell that story, right??) We have reached out to her to invite her to come. David Schwensen will be doing a special program at 5:00 p.m. called "The Beatles in Cleveland" and has actual footage of the concert. It is ironic that this concert was held August 14, 1966, which is literally 56 years ago from our event! We will plan to sell tickets, perhaps in a package with other items for this program, since only there is only a capacity of 150 in the O'Ryan Room for this program.

The group talked about business sponsorships and the hope to be able to purchase some nice prizes for the kids' games.

It appears that the WH Youth Sports League will provide the beer and wine tent and is working to get the temporary licensing in place. Various food trucks will be contacted to fill in the food gap, perhaps mirroring Willoughby's Friday Food Trucks event and perhaps adding some of our local businesses who may have an interest in participating.

One other contest that was discussed was a celebrity look-alike contest where attendees would dress up as their favorite Rock N Roll celebrity...so Elvis may be in the building! The event will also feature a display of classic cars.

We are planning to meet again in a few weeks and are anxious to get other groups and residents involved. If you are interested, plan to come to a future meeting. It will be fun.

When the meeting ended, Councilman Mike Kline and I made a plan to dress up as Sonny and Cher. I was really disappointed though when he called me later to tell me that he changed his mind and had to back out of our plan...he plans to go as "Mike Jagger!" April Fool's!!!
