The Teachers Guild at Lakeland Community College is sponsoring a free, energizing virtual workshop, "#DesignCamp CLE," Tuesday, June 15, from 9-11:30 a.m., for area K-12 educators, administrators and staff. CEUs will be available for participants.

"Both remote and in-person instruction during this past school year have challenged teachers to creatively redesign how they engage and teach their students," said Rachel Siegel, program manager for Lakeland's Teachers Guild and design and innovation specialist for The Lakeland Foundation. "We want to highlight some of the incredible ideas that surfaced as a result. We invite area educators to join us—for free—to see how they, too, can playfully explore design thinking in their classrooms. Using this human-centered framework, they can test out techniques and ideas that promote meaningful learning."

#DesignCamp CLE program facilitators include Mary Kohl, second grade teacher, Perry Local Schools, Leah Konopka Hartmann, special projects lead, Lakeland Community College, Betty Jo Malchesky, assistant superintendent, Perry Local Schools, and Rachel Siegel, Teachers Guild program manager and design and innovation specialist, The Lakeland Foundation.

POOL PASS UPDATE

JUST A REMINDER ABOUT POOL PASS REIMBURSEMENT FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS:

WITHOUT A PUBLIC POOL IN THE CITY, WE RELY ON OUR NEIGHBORS TO PROVIDE THAT PIECE OF RECREATION AND THEN OFFER A SUBSIDY OR REIMBURSEMENT FOR OUR RESIDENTS.

THE INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE CITY OF WILLOUGHBY RECREATION IS AS FOLLOWS:
OSBORNE POOL WILL BE THE POOL AVAILABLE TO WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS, OPENING ON
SATURDAY, MAY 29 UNTIL AUGUST 15. AFTER THAT DATE, THE POOL WILL BE OPEN ON WEEKENDS
ONLY (NOON TO 5PM) UNTIL LABOR DAY. POOL PASSES WILL COST \$125 PER PERSON AND WILLOUGHBY
HILLS WILL OFFER A REFUND OF \$25 PER PASS TO INDIVIDUALS, OR \$35 PER PASS TO SENIORS (AGE 60
AND OVER). RESIDENTS SIMPLY PROVIDE A COPY OF THE RECEIPT PAID TO THE CITY OF WILLOUGHBY
AND WILL RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT, AS NOTED.

COVID update

Lake County has finally reported what we have been waiting to hear..."Between June 1 and June 8, Lake County saw the fewest number of newly reported weekly novel coronavirus cases since June of last year." The county saw 41 cases over the past week, down from 81 reported the week prior according to the Ohio Dept. of Health. This good news comes after the first days this week when a majority of the state's coronavirus-related health orders were lifted.
