MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT:

The Chardon Road resurfacing project is still in Phase 2 with work being done between River Road and Worrell Road. We learned yesterday that the Postal Service has determined that it may be difficult to deliver mail to the residents along this stretch of Chardon Road and mail will be held at the post office for these residents until the construction in that area is complete. Apparently, it is at the mail carrier's discretion and if a safety concern is present for the carrier, he may choose not to deliver but rather leave it at the post office for resident pickup. All of these residents should have been notified, however, please know that this is the information provided to the Mayor's Office. Unfortunately, the City does not have any control over this concern and asks for the patience of our residents as we get through this construction as quickly as possible. Since the workers have now moved to the southern lane, we are optimistic that they are making headway and that portion of the road will be open again soon. We anticipate another two weeks before that occurs.

Our City Engineer has gone out to bid for repaving our City Hall parking lot, using funds allocated from the American Rescue Plan for infrastructure improvements. Bids were opened yesterday and we look forward to beginning this project, along with improvements to the City Hall steps and signage. I will keep you posted as these projects progress.

I am happy that fire hydrant painting has begun and thank Service Superintendent Mark Grubiss for taking the lead on this to make it happen. While normally the Lake County Department of Utilities provides this service, a reduction in manpower has not made it possible for them to take on this task. They have, however, provided the City with the paint for the project and we look forward to getting the hydrants taken care of this year.

The recycle magnets are on the way! Residents should be receiving them this week, if they have not already.

We are looking forward to our Rock N Roll Day in Willoughby Hills on Saturday, August 13, 2022. If you want to volunteer, please call my office. It is going to be a lot of fun!

Finally, since this will be our final newsletter before the Fourth of July holiday, I want to wish everyone a safe and happy holiday. Please remember to follow the law with regard to fireworks. While they can be fun, they can also be very dangerous. Enjoy yourself. Be safe!

FIREWORKS UPDATE BY POLICE CHIEF NAEGELE:

Fourth of July is quickly approaching, and the Willoughby Hills Police Department wants to put out this friendly reminder to all residents and visitors. In 2021, Governor Mike Dewine signed legislation, which as of July 1st provides for purchasing and discharging of certain fireworks in the State of Ohio. However, cities still have the local authority to opt out and continue with any and all restrictions previously put in place. The City of Willoughby Hills opted out, and most fireworks are still illegal to discharge within the City. Current Ohio law provides for the sale and use of trick and novelty fireworks (anything that goes snap, crackle or pop - including sparklers) that are widely available in grocery and department stores. Outside of that, we ask that our residents understand the City's position on this safety matter and our duty to enforce when necessary.

Oftentimes, when a particular act is legal (i.e. discharging fireworks), people think it's safe. That's why you see small children given sparklers which burn at 1800 degrees Fahrenheit – hot enough to melt gold, blind a playmate or set their clothes aflame. There is no safe way to use fireworks and no backyard fireworks are inherently safe. The instructions on the package read – "Light fuse and run in other direction." If there was a safe way to use these explosives, there wouldn't be so many tragic accidents. We need to remember that nearly 50% of fireworks injuries are to innocent bystanders.




