MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT:

THANKS TO ALL OF OUR FINE RESIDENTS WHO CAME OUT FOR OUR DISTRICT 1 AND DISTRICT 2 MEETINGS. DISTRICT 3 MEETING IS SET FOR TUESDAY, OCTOBER 5 AT 6:30 P.M. AT WILLOUGHBY HILLS COMMUNITY CENTER. ALL OF THE MEETINGS FEATURE A NICE POWERPOINT PRESENTATION TO INCLUDE ACCOMPLISHMENTS BY COUNCIL AND ALL OF THE CITY DEPARTMENTS DURING THE PAST YEAR AND A HALF.

MANY POSITIVE THINGS HAVE BEEN ACCOMPLISHED DURING THIS TIME AND I AM VERY HAPPY WHEN I LOOK BACK AT WHAT WE WERE ABLE TO ACCOMPLISH DURING A PANDEMIC. THE CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDING PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO MAXIMIZE OUR EXPENDITURES AND PROVIDE THE SAFEST ENVIRONMENT FOR OUR EMPLOYEES, RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES. THE SECOND ROUND OF FUNDING, THOUGH NOT AS MUCH AS WHAT WAS PROVIDED IN 2020, WILL OFFER US AN OPPORTUNITY FOR ADDITIONAL RECOVERY AND WE ARE CURRENTLY WORKING ON NEXT YEAR'S BUDGET TO CAREFULLY PLAN FOR ITS USE. I PLAN TO PRESENT THE BUDGET TO COUNCIL IN EARLY NOVEMBER (RATHER THAN IN THE EARLY SPRING) SO THAT WE CAN GET THE BUDGET APPROVED AND BEGIN TO PLAN FOR ITEMS EARLIER IN THE YEAR. THIS WILL INCLUDE SAFETY VEHICLES AND SUPPLIES THAT WE NORMALLY PLAN FOR EVERY YEAR IN ORDER TO KEEP OUR FLEET IN TACT AND UP TO DATE. IT IS GOOD TO HEAR RESIDENT FEEDBACK DURING THE DISTRICT MEETINGS BECAUSE THE RESIDENTS ARE TELLING US WHAT THEY FEEL IS IMPORTANT AND IT IS QUITE TIMELY AS WE PLAN THE BUDGET AND SEE WHAT WE CAN DO TO HELP OUR RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES.

UPDATE FROM REPUBLIC SERVICES:

Yard waste service thru Republic Services will end for the season on October 31, 2021 and will resume on April 1, 2022. The City Administration is currently working with Republic Services to ensure that resident yard waste is picked up timely and on the same day as trash/recycle collection. This has been a challenge over the past month due to a transition of new drivers who were recently added to their staff during the pandemic. Republic Services has acknowledged late pickups recently and has committed to make the following improvements for the City of Willoughby Hills:

- Maps are being revised for drivers to ensure that no streets are missed.
- Drivers are to call in to clear portions of their route. The residential dispatcher will review GPS to make sure all streets in this portion of the route were covered. The supervisor will be involved in this process as well.
- Increased supervisor presence in Willoughby Hills will run through the routes to assure streets and sections are not missed.
- Better communication when a route is behind or will be significantly delayed.

Many residents call the Customer Resource Center 1-800-968-7789 and get routed for a missed pick up. Often times if a customer lets Republic know soon enough, they can recover a miss that day or the supervisor can explain where they are on the route. Always leave your yard waste out after you call so Republic can get it picked up.

Republic remains committed to service the City of Willoughby Hills in an efficient manner. Please practice patience as they work through new drivers both for yard waste, as well as trash and recycle, during these unprecedented times. Thank you for your cooperation.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT #8 – ARTICLE VIII-The Electorate Subsection 8.31 ELECTIONS

Charter Review Commission prepared Amendment #8 with the following intent: The proposed language conforms to a federal law, the Uniformed and Overseas citizens Absentee voting Act, which requires absentee ballots to be sent 46 days prior to an election. Currently, the Mayoral runoff election must be held 42 days following the election, which is 4 days short of this requirement. The Charter Review Commission voted to recommend the elimination of a post-election runoff for mayoral candidates. Consequently, the candidate with the most votes will be elected which is how we vote for Council members.

What will change in the Charter then, if this amendment is adopted by the voters? This will eliminate the runoff if the Mayoral candidate does not receive a majority of the votes cast for Mayor. In the November 2019 election, Mayor Gardner defeated candidates (former Councilman) David Fiebig and (Councilwoman) Nancy Fellows with a 51.91% of the votes. How many electors voted in the last general Municipal election? 5,580

THIS IS HOW THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT WILL APPEAR ON THE BALLOT:

ISSUE 10

"PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT- #8

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

"Shall Article VIII – Sub-8.31 - Elections of the Charter of the Willoughby Hills be amended to eliminate a runoff election on the sixth Tuesday immediately following the general municipal election between the leading two vote getters for Mayor in the event no mayoral candidate receives a majority of the vote?"


