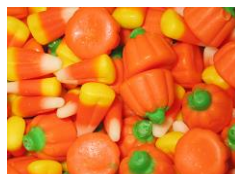
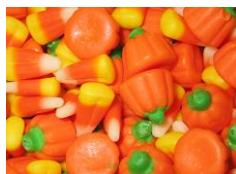
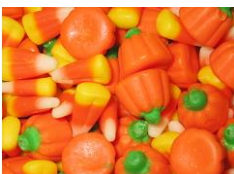

FIRE DEPARTMENT UPDATE:

In the last newsletter, we discussed how it *is* safe to go to the hospital despite concerns about the COVID-19 pandemic. This is particularly important when it comes to life threatening emergencies that require immediate medical attention. Calling 9-1-1 is your access into the advanced world of EMS and pre-hospital care; a system that provides assessment and treatment that is an extension of the hospital, not simply a ride to it. But do you know how to recognize life threatening emergencies; particularly, heart attack, cardiac arrest (no, not the same), and stroke? That is the topic of this week's article. And remember, if you're not sure if you or someone is suffering from these or any other medical emergency, call 9-1-1.

A **heart attack** is the blockage of one of the arteries that supply the heart with blood and oxygen. If a clot blocks one of those arteries, the blood supply will be cut off and the affected heart muscle will suffer. The damage could be minor and hardly noticeable; or it could be extensive and devastating leading to potential cardiac arrest and death. Signs and symptoms of a heart attack can vary from individual to individual depending on age, gender, and medical history and should not be ignored. "Time is Muscle" and every second a heart blockage goes without treatment, irreversible damage may be occurring.

Cardiac Arrest is a condition in which a person suffers a complete collapse of the cardiovascular system meaning their heart stops beating effectively and subsequently breathing stops as well. A heart attack *can* lead to cardiac arrest but there are other potential causes- traumatic injury, electrocution, severe hemorrhage, overdose, congenital or pre-existing conditions, etc.; all which can lead to a disruption of heart's electrical system. Without a beating heart, oxygenated blood cannot be circulated to vital organs (i.e. the brain) and irreversible damage will occur in mere minutes. Recognizing cardiac arrest quickly and starting CPR is critical. A cardiac arrest victim will not respond and will have no movement or signs of breathing such as chest rise. The included video gives a quick lesson on how to perform compression-only CPR which, along with early defibrillation, has been found to make a significant difference in a person's ability to survive cardiac arrest.

Finally, **stroke**, is similar to a heart attack with the exception that it happens in the brain. Some strokes (13%) are caused by a hemorrhage within the brain, but the vast majority of them are caused by a clot that lodges within a blood vessel in the brain and blocks blood flow (aka "brain attack"). The results are the same- the suffocated brain tissue quickly dies without oxygen and the presenting symptoms are determined by the area of the brain affected. If a stroke is recognized and treated quickly enough, a victim may have no lasting effects; but if it isn't, permanent disability may be experienced which is why it is considered a life-threatening emergency. Stroke symptoms that disappear on their own are termed a "TIA" and should not be ignored as it may be indication of an impending full-blown stroke.

SCAM AND SECURITY ALERT

BEWARE OF A SCAM THAT HAS AFFECTED MANY OF OUR RESIDENTS RECENTLY VIA EMAIL. EMAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED ADVISING THE READER THAT THE AUTHOR (A FRIEND) IS IN TROUBLE AND NEEDS MONEY OR GIFT CARDS SENT TO A PARTICULAR ADDRESS. IN DOING SO, THE READER, IN GOOD FAITH COMPLIES TO THE REQUEST, ONLY TO FIND OUT THAT THEIR MONEY OR GIFT CARDS HAVE BEEN SENT TO A SCAMMER AND THEIR FRIEND WAS NEVER IN TROUBLE NOR EVEN KNEW THAT THE EMAIL WAS BEING SENT ON THEIR BEHALF! CHECK OUT ANY TYPE OF STRANGE EMAIL BEFORE JUST "ACTING ON IT." IF IT EVEN SEEMS SUSPICIOUS, CALL THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THEY WILL CHECK IT OUT FOR YOU.

A SECOND SAFETY ADVISEMENT HAS BEEN ISSUED REGARDING STOLEN VEHICLES THROUGHOUT NORTHEAST OHIO AND BECOMING MORE VIOLET. WE WANT EVERYONE TO BE AWARE AND BE ALERT. DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLES UNLOCKED AT ANY TIME. DON'T LEAVE YOUR KEYS IN VEHICLES AND DON'T LEAVE GARAGE DOOR OPENERS EASILY AVAILABLE. RECENT CARJACKINGS (WITH ONE RECENTLY AT GUNPOINT) NECESSITATE THIS BULLETIN, WHICH WAS INTIALLLY ISSUED BY THE LAKE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. 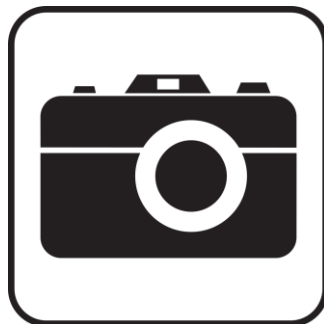

The Road Levy renewal is the only exclusive Willoughby Hills
issue on the ballot.



Whether you choose to “vote by mail”, vote at the Board of Elections, or “vote in person,” it is important that you review the ballot, which includes a renewal of the City’s Road Levy. The issue on the ballot is a 2.5 mil five-year renewal levy **which will not increase your taxes**. The levy generates \$6.53 per month for each \$100,000.00 of your home’s valuation by the County Auditor. These funds are used for the purpose of general construction, reconstruction, resurfacing and repaving of streets, roads and bridges and necessary repairs of road equipment, including our snow plow trucks. Additionally, these funds are used to provide our “local share” of funds in major projects, including the resurfacing of Chardon Road and River Road in the next several years. This year’s funds were used to resurface or pay our local share for Evergreen Drive, Beech Hills Drive, Graylock Drive and Rockefeller Road (south of Chardon Road). Last year the funds were used for Dodd Road (local share) and Trailard Drive, Glengate Drive and Mayfriars Road. The Road Levy renewal is the only exclusive Willoughby Hills issue on the ballot.
