SNOW PLOW INFORMATION:

All primary and secondary roads are highlighted on the four (4) snow plow route maps.

- All state routes and main thoroughfares are considered primary roads and are the #1 priority. These roads include SR 91 (SOM Center Road), SR 6 (Chardon Road), SR 174 (River Road), Worrell Road, Rogers Road, White Road, Eddy Road, Rockefeller Road, SR 84 (Bishop Road), and Maplegrove Road.
- The secondary roads (side streets) will be taken care of when the snow lets up or weathers permits.
- Please be sure to tell your snow plow contractor to not push snow across any street, or leave snow in the street.
- If the City plow hits a mailbox, we will fix it. Please contact us right away. If the post is rotted & falls over from snow, we will not replace the mailbox or post. This will be determined by the Road Supervisor. It is the resident's responsibility to check their mailbox on an annual basis. Snow plow shields can be installed by the resident.
- During heavy snow fall events, please try to avoid going out. Increased traffic adds a significant amount of time to completing the route.

Tips to Avoid Porch Pirates Making Off With Your Loot

With the holiday season in full swing, the Willoughby Hills Police Department is offering some timely theft deterrent tips. Shopping online, especially during this pandemic, provides a convenient method of delivery to your front door. However, this service is also convenient for thieves commonly referred to as "porch pirates."

During this time of the year, area law enforcement commonly see an increase of packages stolen from porches and WHPD expects the trend to continue.

With that in mind, here are some tips to reduce the chances of a porch pirate making off with your packages:

- 1. Pay attention to tracking information and, if possible, be home or have someone you trust pick up your package after it is delivered (family member, friend, trusted neighbor).
- 2. If they will allow it, have your orders sent to your place of employment or have the delivery company hold on to it for you.
- 3. Choose the 'sign for release' option of delivery. That way, the delivery service has to hand your delivery to a person.
- 4. If you are a victim of a theft, immediately contact the Willoughby Hills Police Department to file a report.
- 5. If you have surveillance cameras, share that footage with us. Check with your neighbors to see if they have surveillance cameras and if they would have any footage around the time of theft. Surveillance cameras can also act as a "theft deterrent".
- 6. Keep your porch well lit (Christmas lighting certainly helps). It is getting dark earlier and it may be dark before you get home. A well-lit porch may help neighbors keep an eye out for thieves.

One of the biggest things to emphasize is be a good neighbor and watch out for each other. Keep an eye out for suspicious activity such as cars following delivery trucks and casing neighborhoods, or suspicious person(s) you do not recognize walking up and down the street and "checking things out". If you see people taking packages or any suspicious activity, please contact the police department immediately. The chances of catching the suspected pirate increase substantially the earlier we receive the report.
