MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT:

I HOPE THIS FINDS EVERYONE WELL AND RESTED FROM THE HOLIDAY. THIS YEAR HAS CERTAINLY CONTINUED TO BE SOMEWHAT CHALLENGING THROUGH COVID, BUT WE HAVE MADE THE NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS TO GET BACK ON TRACK AND CONTINUE TO DO THE BEST FOR THE RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES IN WILLOUGHBY HILLS.

I WILL CONTINUE TO GIVE MY COVID-19 UPDATES AT CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS AND WE WILL CONTINUE TO OFFER WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT BOOSTERS AND TESTING AS THE INFORMATION BECOMES AVAILABLE TO US AT CITY HALL. I WAS PLEASED THAT THE LAKE COUNTY GENERAL HEALTH DISTRICT CHOSE OUR COMMUNITY CENTER TO DO THE VACCINES AND BOOSTERS. IT MADE IT EASY FOR OUR RESIDENTS AND I WAS HAPPY TO HEAR THAT 250 PEOPLE WALKED IN LAST WEEK TO GET THE BOOSTER. THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT WILL RESUME THE BOOSTERS ON MONDAY, JANUARY 10 AND YOU ARE ENCOURAGED TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT IF YOU ARE IN NEED OF THE BOOSTER. THE CDC GUIDELINES CHANGED THIS WEEK TO ALLOW BACK TO WORK IN 5 DAYS, RATHER THAN 10 DAYS. THIS SHOULD HELP THE WORKFORCE AND ALLEVIATE THE SHORT STAFFING AND LONG LINES THAT WE HAVE EXPERIENCED RECENTLY.
