MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

As February begins, I wanted to update you on a few matters that were first reported in January.

First, the Police Department received a shipment of steering wheel locks for distribution to our residents if you are the owner of a vulnerable Kia or Hyundai vehicle. These locks will be distributed on a first come, first served basis. You can obtain the steering wheel lock at the Police Department by presenting proof of ownership (or lease) of a Kia or Hyundai and proof of residency. We have a limited supply, so please do not delay coming up if you qualify.

Last night the Master Plan Subcommittee of the Planning Commission-Architectural Board of Review approved the draft Master Plan and submitted the same to Council. I'd like to thank the members of the Subcommittee for their hard work over the last couple of years (it is very hard to try to create a plan with input from community leaders, businesses, residents and other constituents during a pandemic) as well as Mr. David Radachy, the Planning Director from Lake County Planning and Development, for his guidance and assistance in preparing the Master Plan. I believe that the Master Plan will be a great tool for our City. The next step is for Council to review the Master Plan. Mr. Radachy has suggested that Council conduct a work session to discuss the contents of the Plan and then hold a public hearing as they review the Master Plan for final adoption. A few brief recreation updates. On Wednesday night, the Recreation Commission welcomed its newest member, Dave Walters. The Commission also welcomed Lynn Hallum back for another term as she agreed to continue serving on the Commission. Thanks to both Dave and Lynn! As we have mentioned in the Newsletter for the last few months, the City is continuing to seek new Members for the Recreation Commission. This is a fun way to give back to your community no matter what your interests may be. Update: WHPD now has wheel locks for Willoughby Hills residents who own Kia and Hyundai vehicles. We currently do not have an unlimited supply and these will be distributed to residents as long as there is stock available.

In order to pick one up at the Willoughby Hills Police Department, the following is required:

- 1.) Proof of residency in Willoughby Hills.
- 2.) Proof of ownership for a Kia or Hyundai vehicle.

At this time, wheel locks will only be provided to residents who own Kia or Hyundai vehicles due to the amount of auto theft occurring with those specific vehicles across the United States.

I had one very happy Pebblebrook resident stop in this week who wanted to share her recent experience with the City's Fire Department and their Roper Lock Box program. On Wednesday morning, our resident accidentally left her breakfast cooking on the stovetop when she headed out for her morning swim. Her unattended food set off her smoke alarm. Because she was in the water and not near her phone, she wasn't aware that the Fire Department was being dispatched to her home. When she came out of the pool and saw her phone, she threw on her jacket and rushed home expecting the worst. Fortunately, that wasn't the case. You see, when the Fire Department arrived to the resident's locked home, they were able to gain entry by utilizing the resident's Roper Lock Box she had purchased. Not only was the resident elated that entry was gained without damaging her property, she also was so thankful that the firefighters took the time and opened windows to air out her home. She said they came in, did their job assessing the situation, and left her home as though they were never even there. She is forever grateful for their quick response and help—and, additionally, for offering the Roper Lock Box program. Kudos to our City's Fire Department on another job well done!

SENSIBLE SALTING PRACTICES EDUCATION & OUTREACH—TIPS AT HOME:

SHOVEL SNOW

- * Remove snow and ice during snowstorm, if possible.
- * Reduces that amount of salt required.
- * Increases efficiency.

FOLLOW APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

* More salt does not correspond to quicker melting.

REDUCE CHEMICAL APPLICATION

- * Only apply where really needed.
- * Create paths instead of removing all snow.

CONSIDER TEMPERATURE

- * Most salts are ineffective below 15°F.
- * Sand coupled for traction, but must be swept up after.

SWEEP UP EXTRA

* No longer working.

PET SAFETY

* Sodium Chloride, Calcium Chloride, and Magnesium Chloride can burn paws.

* Please note: If your child <u>currently attends our W-E preschool program</u>, you do not need to complete the New Student Registration. Contact your child's school to let them know that your child is planning on attending Kindergarten in the fall.

RESIDENTIAL SUMMER SPRINKLER PROGRAM

It's almost time to start thinking about Summer! Did you know that Willoughby Hills has authorized a program for eligible homeowners which could reduce the costs paid for sewer charges each year during the months of May through September?

With your water bill you are charged sewer fees which are based on your total use of water. With the Summer Sprinkler Program, if you use more water during the summer months for sprinkling and other seasonal usage, your summer water bill will reflect a lower sewer usage based on a prorated consumption taking into consideration the difference between your usage in the winter months. This program applies to sewer charges only. You must still pay the Lake County Water Department for all water used.

There is a one-time administrative fee of \$20 payable by cash or check (payable to City of Willoughby Hills) which must be submitted with the completed <u>Summer Sprinkler Program Application</u>. Applications with payment must be received by April 30, 2023.

Key things to note with the program:

- Available to **residential customers only** who own one, two, three, or four unit dwelling excluding condominiums and apartments.
- Residents who are tapped into the sewers.
- Residents who water gardens and lawns in the summer will see the biggest benefit.
- Once a resident enrolls in the program, they are enrolled for as long as they own the property.
- Enrollment after the April 30th deadline will not be effective until the following year.
- Resident will not begin to receive the reduced summer rate until they have been in the property for one year. This is a Lake County Department of Utilities (LCDU) requirement necessary for determining "normal" levels of usage.
- If a resident is filling a swimming pool, it is most financially beneficial to them to contact a vendor who provides bulk water sales as this water rate is generally cheaper than the LCDU rate and the resident will have no sewer charges to pay on the bulk water purchase.
