#### MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

As we continue to move through winter into spring in Willoughby Hills, I thought it was important to use this week's Mayor's Report to highlight one of our most significant safety issues.

A source of great beauty and providing numerous opportunities for recreational activities, the Chagrin River is one of the great resources of our community. However, as reported in our last newsletter and in the News-Herald yesterday, the Chagrin can also be very dangerous, especially during the late winter and early spring. January 21st marked the 64th Anniversary of the tragic loss of five of our residents in the Flood of 1959. At this time of year, the river can rise quickly either due to rain or as a result of ice jamming, as we witnessed last year. If you live near the River, please always keep an eye on the river level and if it starts to rise near flood levels, please be ready to evacuate if necessary. As Chief Gandee reminded everyone in yesterday's News-Herald article: "If there's a recommendation to evacuate, it's important for people to understand they may have the ability to stay, but in some cases, the fire department and other rescue services may not be able to come because it may be too dangerous for them."

Additionally, if the river freezes over, please do not walk or ride vehicles on the ice. While the ice may be thick in one area it can be almost paper thin in others (which can easily be hidden under even a light snowfall). The current underneath the ice can be very strong and sweep somebody underneath the ice before help can arrive.

A few other brief items: The warmer weather is allowing our service crew to make some improvements to City buildings. They have been constructing an additional conference room in City Hall and freshening up the paint in the Fire Department.

Chief Naegele has reported that many residents are taking advantage of the free steering wheel locks. Please come up to the Police Department if you own or lease either a Kia or Hyundai. Please bring evidence of ownership or lease and proof of residency.




In order to pick one up at the Willoughby Hills Police Department, the following is required:

Please keep in mind that Cleveland Metroparks will be continuing their deer management program this winter to establish and maintain a balanced ecosystem. From noon to 6:00 a.m. the following morning, portions or all of North Chagrin Reservation will be closed to the public on several days from now through March 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

Specific closures will be posted on <u>Cleveland Metroparks Alerts and Closures</u> page by 6 p.m. on the evening prior to an area's closure. This announcement will give details about reservations and sections of the parkway that will be closed between noon and 6 a.m. the following morning.

#### **RESIDENTIAL SUMMER SPRINKLER PROGRAM**

It's almost time to start thinking about Summer! Did you know that Willoughby Hills has authorized a program for eligible homeowners which could reduce the costs paid for sewer charges each year during the months of May through September?

With your water bill you are charged sewer fees which are based on your total use of water. With the Summer Sprinkler Program, if you use more water during the summer months for sprinkling and other seasonal usage, your summer water bill will reflect a lower sewer usage based on a prorated consumption taking into consideration the difference between your usage in the winter months. This program applies to sewer charges only. You must still pay the Lake County Water Department for all water used.

There is a one-time administrative fee of \$20 payable by cash or check (payable to City of Willoughby Hills) which must be submitted with the completed <u>Summer Sprinkler</u> <u>Program Application</u>. Applications with payment must be received by April 30, 2023.

Key things to note with the program:

- Available to **residential customers only** who own one, two, three, or four unit dwelling excluding condominiums and apartments.
- Residents who are tapped into the sewers.
- Residents who water gardens and lawns in the summer will see the biggest benefit.
- Once a resident enrolls in the program, they are enrolled for as long as they own the property.
- Enrollment after the April 30th deadline will not be effective until the following year.
- Resident will not begin to receive the reduced summer rate until they have been in the property for one year. This is a Lake County Department of Utilities (LCDU) requirement necessary for determining "normal" levels of usage.
- If a resident is filling a swimming pool, it is most financially beneficial to them to contact a vendor who provides bulk water sales as this water rate is generally cheaper than the LCDU rate and the resident will have no sewer charges to pay on the bulk water purchase.
