#### **MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT**

Happy Friday Willoughby Hills!

Tuesday evening City Council's Finance Committee held its first of two Budget hearings. This hearing focused on the Service Department and Fire Department. A hearing scheduled for Wednesday, March 15 will focus on the Police Department and Administrative budgets. Councilman Kline, Chair of the Finance Committee of Council, welcomes questions from the public, you can email him at <a href="MikeKline@Willoughbyhills-oh.gov">MikeKline@Willoughbyhills-oh.gov</a>.

I wanted to share a few items that were discussed in the hearing with all of you. First, the City is fortunate that the price of road salt is almost the same as last year. If the current relatively mild weather continues, the City will have a nice stockpile of salt to carry into next winter at the same price as last year. With the construction of the new Salt Storage Facility, we have the perfect place to store the salt. The focus of the City's road resurfacing program will be the cost of the engineering and local share for the ODOT Chardon Road resurfacing project (West from SOM Center Road to Bishop Road). These costs will be incurred this year and the resurfacing will take place in 2024. The City will be resurfacing Pleasant Valley Road (from the Bridge West to Chardon Road) and restriping all roads in the City. I am also hoping that we will again be able to coordinate repainting of fire hydrants in the City with the Lake County Water Department.

Chief Gandee presented for the Fire Department. We continue to focus on increasing staffing and updating our vehicle fleet. The 2023 budget includes funding for a 6th firefighter on all shifts at the Fire Department. Our hope is that we will be able to provide more staffing on our emergency responses while, at the same time, having a buffer in place to avoid overtime in the event that a scheduled firefighter cannot work their shift. Chief Gandee reported that our new Incident Command Vehicle is in its final stages of upfitting and should be on the road in the next 3 weeks. The Fire Department's new Fire Engine will start to be built this month, with delivery late this summer. A new ambulance will be ordered to come into service in 2024 and the replacement for the Fire Chief's emergency response vehicle is expected to be delivered next quarter. In addition, the Service Department has been able to do some projects to "freshen up" some of the spaces in the Fire Department. The Department has obtained many grants to assist with the cost of equipment replacement over the years (new SCBA's, radios, hoses, thermal imaging equipment) and will continue to pursue those grants. The Department is also evaluating the use of grants to add additional full-time personnel.

Finally, I want to remind everyone that this Sunday is the City Recreation Commission's Annual All-You-Can-Eat Pancake Breakfast. Doors open at 8:30 AM and we will be serving until 12:30 PM. We have a great bunch of volunteers ready to go. As usual, I will be working in the kitchen, but don't hesitate to knock and say "Hi" to me and the wonderful team of cooks that will be preparing our delicious breakfast. I hope to see you there!

#### **COMMISSION MEMBERS NEEDED FOR 2023**

The **Recreation Commission** is seeking new members to assist with the planning and implementation of City recreation events including: Pancake Breakfasts, the Easter Scavenger Hunt, Fall and Spring Craft Shows, the City Halloween Party, Winterfest, Christmas Card Lane, the Holiday Lights Contest, the City Photo Contest and Breakfast with Santa. The Commission is also evaluating a potential all day City event (similar to Rock and Roll Day in 2022). Anyone who is interested in becoming a part of the Commission can fill out an application and deliver it to City Hall.

The **Board of Building and Zoning Appeals** is seeking a new member for a five (5) year term beginning on January 1, 2023. If there is an appeal, the Board of Zoning Appeals currently meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 8:00 P.M. in City Council Chambers. The **Civil Service Commission** is seeking a new Chairperson. This is a six (6) year term on a Commission that serves the purpose of developing and maintaining lists of candidates eligible for hire by the City as Full-Time Police and Fire Personnel. The Commission generally meets quarterly or on an as-needed basis.

#### RESIDENTIAL SUMMER SPRINKLER PROGRAM

It's almost time to start thinking about Summer! Did you know that Willoughby Hills has authorized a program for eligible homeowners which could reduce the costs paid for sewer charges each year during the months of May through September?

With your water bill you are charged sewer fees which are based on your total use of water. With the Summer Sprinkler Program, if you use more water during the summer months for sprinkling and other seasonal usage, your summer water bill will reflect a lower sewer usage based on a prorated consumption taking into consideration the difference between your usage in the winter months. This program applies to sewer charges only. You must still pay the Lake County Water Department for all water used.

There is a one-time administrative fee of \$20 payable by cash or check (payable to City of Willoughby Hills) which must be submitted with the completed <u>Summer Sprinkler Program Application</u>. Applications with payment must be received by April 30, 2023.


Key things to note with the program:

- Available to **residential customers only** who own one, two, three, or four unit dwelling excluding condominiums and apartments.
- Residents who are tapped into the sewers.
- Residents who water gardens and lawns in the summer will see the biggest benefit.
- Once a resident enrolls in the program, they are enrolled for as long as they own the property.
- Enrollment after the April 30th deadline will not be effective until the following year.
- Resident will not begin to receive the reduced summer rate until they have been in the property for one year. This is a Lake County Department of Utilities (LCDU) requirement necessary for determining "normal" levels of usage.
- If a resident is filling a swimming pool, it is most financially beneficial to them to contact a vendor who provides bulk water sales as this water rate is generally cheaper than the LCDU rate and the resident will have no sewer charges to pay on the bulk water purchase.



WHPD now has wheel locks for Willoughby Hills residents who own Kia and Hyundai vehicles. We currently do not have an unlimited supply and these will be distributed to residents as long as there is stock available.

In order to pick one up at the Willoughby Hills Police Department, the following is required:



- 1.) Proof of residency in Willoughby Hills.
- 2.) Proof of ownership for a Kia or Hyundai vehicle.

At this time, wheel locks will only be provided to residents who own Kia or Hyundai vehicles due to the amount of auto theft occurring with those specific vehicles across the United States.







Willoughby Hills Fire Department is coordinating with the American Red Cross to plan a date to install smoke detectors in some select areas in our community.
