MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

Happy Friday Willoughby Hills!

Last Saturday City Council hosted a Retreat to discuss a number of issues that they are planning to address this year. One of the issues discussed was starting the process to build bike paths in the City, specifically along SOM Center Road and between the parks in the City. This is a program that was discussed extensively by the City Planning Commission's Master Plan Committee. David Radachy from the Lake County Planning and Community Development Department lead the discussion and has been a great resource for the City. The Master Plan will be coming before Council for approval in the next few weeks and this initiative will be one of the first items started after approval. Council and the Administration also had a very productive discussion with members of the City's Senior Center Board to review their upcoming proposal to improve the current facility in the Community Center and their current work to add additional programs. I am grateful for their hard work on behalf of our Senior residents We also discussed current cell tower requirements in the City and the current status of regulation of short-term rentals by the State of Ohio and other communities with options for the regulation of the same in our City. Finally, former Council member and current Mentor Economic Development Director Kevin Malecek presented avenues to pursue economic development for the City. It was a very good meeting and I appreciate the efforts of our Council to organize the program and coordinate with our speakers. Thanks also to Council Clerk Laura O'Donnell and Communications Supervisor Karen Mehollin for their hard work. I look forward to working with Council and our other Boards and Commissions to address these issues and others over the remainder of the year.

The proposed Sheetz gas station and convenience store received final approval from the Planning Commission last night. This facility will be located at the Northwest corner of the intersection of Chardon Road and Bishop Road (where the Bakers Square restaurant was located).

We have received a great deal of information this week about your options to participate (or not participate) in the NOPEC contracts for gas and electricity. Please see Page 12 in this newsletter for information about enrollment, rates and opting out of NOPEC if you would like to select your own provider.

Thanks to Dave and Denise Reichelt for hosting this week's Trivia Night in Willoughby Hills and for their support of Trivia Night. We continue to have strong attendance from Willoughby Hills and many other nearby communities. Please consider attending the City's next Trivia Night in Willoughby Hills on May 16th.

The Recreation Commission's City-Wide Garage Sale will be next Saturday, April 29, 2023. This is a great chance to enjoy the Spring weather, meet your neighbors and fellow residents and find some great bargains.

O.D.O.T. PROJECTS



The following is a list of upcoming ODOT projects set to take place in Willoughby Hills. Some are coming up very soon while others are on the horizon a bit. Regardless, we are always grateful to ODOT for this investment in our community.

The first of several ODOT road and bridge improvements will begin with the **River Road Slope Repair** which entails installing a series of SRT plate piles to stabilize the slope along the west side of River Road. Both lanes of River Road approximately 600 feet south of Chardon Road near address 2770 River Road will be closed for 14 days beginning 4/24/23 until 5/8/23 (dates may vary slightly depending on weather and other miscellaneous factors). Traffic will be detoured through SOM Center Road so *please plan accordingly*.

Future ODOT projects are as follows:

- Chardon Road (West of SR 91 to Bishop Rd.): To be resurfaced in 2024
- River Road Resurfacing (2 years):
 Construction Start: Phase 1 Summer 2025;
 Phase 2 Summer 2026 (both tentative)
- Chardon Road High Bridge Deck Replacement: Construction Start: Spring 2025 (tentative)
- Chardon Road Bridge over I-271 Replacement: Construction Start: Spring 2026 (tentative)

FIRE

PLEASE NOTE:

With the weather turning warmer people will want to have outdoor fires. Here is a summary of what is permitted related to recreational fires.

It is important to note that the burning of yard waste is prohibited.

Thankfully we have curbside yard waste pickup that allows for an alternative to burning the materials.

We recently had our aerial ladder truck come back from being out of service since March 2, 2023 due to a bad drive to pump gear. The repairs were completed and the rig was pump tested. The truck was returned to us and put back in service. Thank you to Countryside Truck Services!

One assignment that was put on hold was the replacement of the flagpole halyards. As Luck would have it, one of the halyards broke and we needed our aerial ladder truck to replace it. We decided to replace them all since they were becoming dry rotted.

In addition, this provided a great opportunity for our newer members to train on this specialized apparatus in a non-emergency setting.





Special thanks to all of the seniors who came out for Tuesday's Potluck Luncheon. We had a great crowd who came to gather and enjoy our guest speaker, Fire Chief Rob Gandee who spoke about two great safety items for seniors (the lock box and the Vial of Life). Chief Gandee also spoke about the importance of smoke detectors, citing that upgrading from perhaps an older unit may be advisable in that the new smoke and CO detectors now have 15-year battery lives, with a smoke detector available for hearing impaired individuals as well. He spoke of the importance of having visible house numbers on your home so that the emergency vehicles can easily locate you in the event of an emergency. With cursive writing no longer being taught in many schools, the addresses that are "spelled out" should be considered for upgrade as well. Special thanks to Lake County Council on Aging for providing a supply of the Vial of Life magnet pouches for our luncheon. We have a limited number left that will be offered at the next Senior Luncheon in May, on a first come, first served basis. Thank you again, Chief Gandee for a very enlightening presentation!





Our next Senior Potluck Luncheon is set for Tuesday, May 16 at 11:30 a.m. Our speaker is NOPEC Representative Genny Costanzo. With the current changes in electric rates, residents will need to make a decision about a supplier for their electric service. As was stated earlier, residents are free to "opt out" by choosing a provider other than NOPEC by shopping on the PUCO website "Apples to Apples Comparison." If you do not "opt out," WH residents will automatically be brought back into NOPEC (from the Illuminating Company) at the rate of 6.450 cents per kWh beginning June 2023. There are currently a 12-month fixed rate program (6.875 cents per kWh) and 24-month fixed rate program (6.850 cents per kWh) effective June 2023 that you must call 1-855-667-3201 at NOPEC to take advantage of. Plan to bring your bill if you still have questions and Genny will be happy to work you through this process!

YARD WASTE SERVICE INFORMATION FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

We also ask that if you are utilizing the cardboard recycle bins at City Hall that boxes be broken down and ONLY cardboard be put in the bins. PLEASE DO NOT THROW TRASH IN THE RECYCLE BINS!

Summer 2023 Information



POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM

As the Mayor mentioned in his report earlier, the Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting and it was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

Season Pass (up to age 59) \$50 (resident cost would be \$85)

Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) \$60 (resident cost would be \$75)

Willoughby will then invoice the City of Willoughby Hills for the difference for each pass purchased. Please call the Mayor's Office at 440-918-8730 if you have any questions regarding this program.

SUMMER SPRINKLER PROGRAM

Don't forget about our Summer Sprinkler Program: Signup Deadline is April 30th!

The City of Willoughby Hills has authorized a program for eligible homeowners which could reduce the costs paid for sewer charges each year during the months of May through September. With your water bill, you are charged sewer fees which are based on your total use of water (except septic customers). With the Summer Sprinkling Program, if you use more water during the summer months for sprinkling and other seasonal usage, your summer water bill will reflect a lower sewer usage based on a prorated consumption taking into consideration the difference between your usage in the winter months. This program applies to sewer charges only. You must still pay the Lake County Water Department for all the water used. A one-time administrative fee of \$20 must be submitted with the completed Residential Summer Sprinkling Application form, which must be received by April 30th.

SUMMER BLOCK PARTIES

The City of Willoughby Hills encourages Block Parties in the community in order for neighbors to get to know each other and enjoy living in the City.

The City is committed to assist residents who plan a Block Party in their neighborhood by: Providing barriers to block off the street during the event, arranging for a representative from the City's Police, Fire, or Service Department to make an appearance at the event (often times with a treat bag for the kids), arranging for the Mayor or Council member to visit in order to allow the guests to become familiar with their representatives, providing information for your menu planning with contacts from Willoughby Hills businesses, and finally to provide an alternate location at one of the City's Campbell Park pavilions if your street would prohibit or make such a gathering difficult.

NOPEC NEWS

- Eligible residents and small business owners have received (or will soon be receiving) enrollment letters from NOPEC regarding natural gas and electric aggregation programs for the period beginning with customers' June 2023 meter read dates.
- There are two enrollment letters from NOPEC to look for in your mail: one for electric enrollment and one for natural gas enrollment.
- With both letters you will have a choice: Opt-In or Opt-Out.
- <u>If you'd like to opt in to enroll in NOPEC's Standard Program Price</u>: You don't need to take any action when you receive your letters as you will automatically be enrolled.
- If you'd like to opt out of enrolling in both or either aggregation programs: You <u>MUST</u> return the opt-out form attached to your enrollment letter to NOPEC by mail, fax (440-774-4422), or <u>it can now be done by email</u> by taking a picture of your completed form and emailing it to <u>out@nopec.org</u> by the date indicated on your letter.


LAKE COUNTY NEWS

ARCHITECTURAL BOARD OF REVIEW GUIDELINES

Below are a list of the updated Architectural Design Guidelines as discussed at the March 16th Planning Commission—Architectural Board of Review Meeting. If you would like to voice your opinion or concerns, please join us at an upcoming PC-ABR meeting held every 1st and 3rd meeting of the month at 7:00pm in Council Chambers. Architectural Board of Review Design Guidelines

Date: 03/17/2023

1. Purpose

- a. Protect and preserve the appearance and character of the community,
- b. Protect the desirable characteristics and promote the stability of existing buildings,
- Promote the use of quality materials and construction practices to maintain and grow the value of investments in the community.

2. Architectural Style

- a. Style, materials, and colors of building alterations and accessory structures shall match principal building.
- b. Trim, minimum 4 inches wide, shall be provided around all doors and windows unless otherwise approved by the ABR.
- c. Masonry facing along front building elevation shall return a minimum 24 inches around corners unless approved by ABR.

3. Masonry Aboveground

- a. No more than 8 inches in height of plain block or concrete will be accepted above ground unless approved by the ABR or is an alteration to an existing condition.
- b. Painted or stained block or concrete will not be accepted unless approved by ABR,
- c. Exposed block or concrete greater than 8 inches in heights shall be:
 - Covered with brick or stone facing,
 - ii. Split face or other integrally textured and colored block or concrete,
 - iii. Other architecturally enhanced covering approved by ABR.


