MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

I wanted to start this week's report by thanking our former Finance Director Frank Brichacek for all of his hard work over the last 15 years for the residents of Willoughby Hills. Frank's patience, thoroughness, compassion for residents and passion for problem solving and responsible stewardship of City funds will truly be missed in City Hall. When Frank first came to the City in 2008, our records were not auditable and the City wasn't sure of the actual balance in the General Fund (but it was assumed to be something less than \$20,000). Over the last 15 years, Frank's leadership has brought us to a place where the City now regularly wins awards from the State Auditor and, working with Mayor Weger's administration and current City leadership, the City now has a General Fund balance in excess of \$3,400,000. In addition to working with and assisting our City Department leaders for the last decade and a half, Frank has trained finance department assistant directors who are now considered leaders in government finance around Northeastern Ohio. He has left a true legacy from his career and we wish him all the best as he eases into retirement (and continues to assist current Finance Director Bruce Scott with his transition into the Finance Director's position). Thanks to Karen Mehollin, Sharen Michney-Halkiewicz and Laura O'Donnell for coordinating our staff and resident events to honor Frank yesterday!

Michael Sivo and Dr. Laura Surovi were kind enough to offer me and Council a tour of their beautiful new Cleveland Veterinary Rehabilitation ("CVR") facility at the intersection of Chardon Road and Orchard Street. This facility is a beautiful addition to our community, both inside and out. The CVR facility offers state of the art care for pets rehabilitating from medical treatments or injuries. Michael and Dr. Laura proudly showed us the resistance pool, hyperbaric chamber (the only one for animals in the State of Ohio), underwater treadmills, exercise area and other facilities they offer to heal their patients. Their business is attracting clients from not only Ohio and the region, but also from as far away as Canada! I am very proud that the City was able to work with Michael and Dr. Laura, their team and the Willoughby-Eastlake City Schools to bring this amazing resource to our City. Thank-you Michael and Dr. Laura for your investment in the City of Willoughby Hills and your passion in bringing this dream to reality.

This week was Administrative Professionals Week. I want to express my thanks to the City's many administrative professionals for their hard work: Finance Assistant Sharen Michney-Halkiewicz, Clerk of Court Debbie Blankenship and Deputy Clerk of Court Teresa Romano, Police Chief's Assistant Debbie (Semik) Reeves and Police Department Clerks Lindsay Bushman and Janet Schuller, Fire Department Administrative Assistant/Chief's Assistant Stephanie Nero, Service/Building Department Assistant Stacey Rentz and Clerks Laura O'Donnell, Katie Lloyd and Darlene McFarren. 

NOPEC UPDATE (Electric):

I attended NOPEC's Virtual Meeting on Saturday, April 22. Most of the items brought up we have already discussed in Senior emails/newsletters, but here are a few points that I learned at the meeting:

- The NOPEC Standard Rate option (6.45 cents per kWh) is a fixed rate which is locked in for six months. After that, the rate will change to a variable rate (price yet to be determined), After six months, those who are already in the Standard Rate Program will automatically stay in at the new rate, unless they opt out or if they then choose NOPEC's 12 or 24-month fixed rate plan. In essence, if you want to make sure of stability, it would be advisable to sign up fo the 12 or 24 month fixed plan now.
- Residents who may not have received a letter (for either Opt Out of electric or gas), may be
 under contract with another company, may be on PIP or other low income assistance program
 where letters are not mailed out to the customers.

That was about all the new information provided. On the next page, I will provide all the information I have learned, with rates, that may help you through this process. Please reach out to me if you have any other questions.

NOPEC INFORMATION

(Prepared by Gloria Majeski)

Information regarding Electric Rates:

NOPEC's proposed rates (cents per kWh):

Standard: 6.45 12-month fixed: 6.874 24-month fixed: 6.85

Other companies' rates that are lower than NOPEC currently:

12-month fixed (w/o fees): Shipley Choice 0.0678 per kWh

24-month fixed (w/o fees): Public Power LLC 0.0659 and Energy Harbor 0.0677 per kWh All other options are available on the apples to apples comparison on the PUCO website but appear to exceed NOPEC's price.

My analysis:

Upon review of my electric bill where 448 kWh hours were used last month, here is what the comparison math looks like:

448 kWh X 0.0685 (NOPEC's 24 mos.) = \$30.69

448 kWh X 0.0659 (Public Power's 24 mos.) = \$29.52

The difference is \$1.17 per month. One thing not mentioned to our residents, however, that should be considered when contemplating whether to spend that extra \$1.17 per month (or whatever yours works out to be), is the fact that NOPEC, and no others, offer the City grants in both energy conservation benefits and sponsorship based on the number of NOPEC enrolled residents. Having worked with these grants in the past at City Hall, I can tell you that NOPEC's Energy Conservation (NEC) grant was used over the past 14+ years to do such projects as replacement of all of the windows and doors at City Hall and the Police and Fire Departments, as well as LED lighting replacement throughout City buildings. These grants have varied over the years, ranging from approximately \$20,000 to \$36,000. The NOPEC sponsorship grant, too, is in the amount of \$1500 annually and contributes funding to Recreation sponsored events such as music festivals, Halloween parties or the City's Touch a Truck event. Without these NOPEC grants, these projects would have come out of the City's General Fund or not done at all.

I am just mentioning this because it has NOT been mentioned before and I think it deserves to be told. Based on what your savings works out to be, take a look and see if this is something you feel is worthwhile.

Information regarding Gas Rates:

NOPEC's proposed rates (per mCf);

Standard: \$6.99 12-month fixed: \$4.99 24-month fixed: \$5.09

Other companies' rates that are currently lower than NOPEC (fixed & w/o fees):

24 months: None beat NOPEC's rate of \$5.09

12 months: Better than Yesterday (\$4.20), Mercury Energy (\$4.38), AEF Energy (\$4.39), and Shipley Choice (\$4.69)

Standard: Numerous companies are lower than NOPEC's \$6.99, such as the following fixed with no fees: Symmetry Energy (\$5.35 fixed X 36 mos.), Direct Energy (\$4.59 fixed X 7 mos.), Energy Harbor (\$5.19 fixed x 18 mos.) and Mercury Energy (\$5.18 fixes for 36 mos. or \$4.38 fixed for 12 mos.). (More options on PUCO website, too!)

There are definitely some good options here, but based on the numbers I am seeing, chances are that the rates will continue to go up and it may be wise to lock it in now or decide that you will commit to checking the apples to apples comparison on a regular basis to move to the best rates for your budget!

Hope this helps to answer some of your questions. I enjoyed the 4/22 Virtual meeting. I look forward to the NOPEC representative at our next Senior Potluck Lunch!

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM

The Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting and it was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

Season Pass (up to age 59) \$50 (resident cost would be \$85)

Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) \$60 (resident cost would be \$75)

Willoughby will then invoice the City of Willoughby Hills for the difference for each pass purchased. Please call the Mayor's Office at 440-918-8730 if you have any questions regarding this program.

NOPEC NEWS



- Eligible residents and small business owners have received (or will soon be receiving) enrollment letters from NOPEC regarding natural gas and electric aggregation programs for the period beginning with customers' June 2023 meter read dates.
- There are two enrollment letters from NOPEC to look for in your mail: one for electric enrollment and one for natural gas enrollment.
- With both letters you will have a choice: Opt-In or Opt-Out.
- If you'd like to opt in to enroll in NOPEC's Standard Program Price: You don't need to take any action when you receive your letters as you will automatically be enrolled.
- If you'd like to opt out of enrolling in both or either aggregation programs: You <u>MUST</u> return the opt-out form attached to your enrollment letter to NOPEC by mail, fax (440-774-4422), or <u>it can now be done by email</u> by taking a picture of your completed form and emailing it to <u>out@nopec.org</u> by the date indicated on your letter.

Gas rates:

Standard: \$6.690/Mcf

Monthly Variable: \$2.361/Mcf 12 Month Fixed: \$4.990/Mcf


LAKE COUNTY NEWS

ARCHITECTURAL BOARD OF REVIEW GUIDELINES

Below are a list of the updated Architectural Design Guidelines as discussed at the March 16th Planning Commission—Architectural Board of Review Meeting. Architectural Board of Review Design Guidelines

Date: 03/17/2023

1. Purpose

- a. Protect and preserve the appearance and character of the community,
- b. Protect the desirable characteristics and promote the stability of existing buildings,
- c. Promote the use of quality materials and construction practices to maintain and grow the value of investments in the community.

2. Architectural Style

- a. Style, materials, and colors of building alterations and accessory structures shall match principal building.
- b. Trim, minimum 4 inches wide, shall be provided around all doors and windows unless otherwise approved by the ABR.
- c. Masonry facing along front building elevation shall return a minimum 24 inches around corners unless approved by ABR.

3. Masonry Aboveground

- a. No more than 8 inches in height of plain block or concrete will be accepted above ground unless approved by the ABR or is an alteration to an existing condition.
- b. Painted or stained block or concrete will not be accepted unless approved by ABR,
- c. Exposed block or concrete greater than 8 inches in heights shall be:
 - Covered with brick or stone facing,
 - ii. Split face or other integrally textured and colored block or concrete,
 - iii. Other architecturally enhanced covering approved by ABR.




