MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

There are so many reasons to love Spring, especially here in Willoughby Hills. First, as the weather warms up, and hopefully dries up, we are blessed to have the Hach-Otis Sanctuary State Nature Preserve (more on this below), Roemisch Fields, Campbell Park, North Chagrin Reservation, Gully Brook Park, Pleasant Valley Park, Manakiki Golf Course and Airport Greens Golf Course right here in Willoughby Hills. About 20% of the land in Willoughby Hills is dedicated to parks and recreation! I hope you will all take advantage of the many opportunities to enjoy the beauty of Spring at these parks and golf courses right here in the City.

If you have never had the chance to explore the Hach-Otis Sanctuary State Nature Preserve, Spring is a great time to visit and the City is happy to provide a guided tour. This beautiful property, owned by the Audubon Society and protected by the State, is located at the end of Skyline Drive, which is just North of Chardon Road on the East side of River Road. At 1:00 P.M. on both May 13 and May 20, Hach-Otis Caretaker John Lillich will lead nature walks through the property. No registration or reservations are required, just meet at the Sanctuary's entrance. John had nearly 50 attendees for the fall color walk last year (photo below), and I am hoping that many of you will get the chance to meet John and learn about the history, geography and flora and fauna of the City and Chagrin River Valley that can be observed at Hach-Otis.

Spring also brings softball and baseball back to the City. The fields at Roemisch Park will soon be busy with games in the evenings. The City's Service Department has worked with the Youth Sports League and Recreation Commission to upgrade two of the fields by installing new crushed stone infields to improve drainage. The plan is to install the crushed stone in 3 more fields this summer as the materials become available. Good luck to all of our players, coaches, parents and fans this season. If you have a chance, stop up to Roemisch, see some of your neighbors, enjoy some snacks from the Concession Stand and cheer on our teams one evening.

Finally, Spring brings graduations. I know many of you will be attending High School and College graduations for your loved ones this month. Congratulations to all of our graduates and their families!

SERVICE

The City's Service Department will be starting asphalt repairs throughout the City. Please be patient and mindful of the workers when you're out and about.

The Service Department received its' new plow truck a couple of days ago. This truck is going to be our 4th front line truck which is needed do to the age of our trucks. This is our first truck with a v box spreader which is an insert in the bed of the truck allowing the changeover when doing leaves during snow events. The v box spreader also eliminates having to raise the bed while driving down the road and causing possible damage to power lines and cables. The spreader holds approximately 7.6 tons of salt which is enough to complete the route one time. This truck also has a live P.T.O which runs the hydraulics which shortens the distance that the plow sticks out off the front of the vehicle to help with making turns. The truck also has a 2 stage engine brake that helps on brake life (slows the truck down without hitting the brakes). The vehicle is also going to serve as a dump truck during the summer months on our asphalt and storm sewer projects as it is a dual purpose vehicle.

YARD WASTE SERVICE INFORMATION FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

*PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PRICE OF YELLOW TRASH BAGS HAS INCREASED. THEY ARE NOW \$40.50 FOR A ROLL OF 10. THANK YOU!







POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM

The Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting and it was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

Season Pass (up to age 59) \$50 (resident cost would be \$85)

Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) \$60 (resident cost would be \$75)

Willoughby will then invoice the City of Willoughby Hills for the difference for each pass purchased. Please call the Mayor's Office at 440-918-8730 if you have any questions regarding this program.

SUMMER BLOCK PARTIES

The City of Willoughby Hills encourages Block Parties in the community in order for neighbors to get to know each other and enjoy living in the City.

The City is committed to assist residents who plan a Block Party in their neighborhood by: Providing barriers to block off the street during the event, arranging for a representative from the City's Police, Fire, or Service Department to make an appearance at the event (often times with a treat bag for the kids), arranging for the Mayor or Council member to visit in order to allow the guests to become familiar with their representatives, providing information for your menu planning with contacts from Willoughby Hills businesses, and finally to provide an alternate location at one of the City's Campbell Park pavilions if your street would prohibit or make such a gathering difficult.

ARCHITECTURAL BOARD OF REVIEW GUIDELINES

Below are a list of the updated Architectural Design Guidelines as discussed at the March 16th Planning Commission—Architectural Board of Review Meeting. Architectural Board of Review Design Guidelines

Date: 03/17/2023

1. Purpose

- a. Protect and preserve the appearance and character of the community,
- b. Protect the desirable characteristics and promote the stability of existing buildings,
- Promote the use of quality materials and construction practices to maintain and grow the value of investments in the community.

2. Architectural Style

- a. Style, materials, and colors of building alterations and accessory structures shall match principal building.
- b. Trim, minimum 4 inches wide, shall be provided around all doors and windows unless otherwise approved by the ABR.
- c. Masonry facing along front building elevation shall return a minimum 24 inches around corners unless approved by ABR.

3. Masonry Aboveground

- a. No more than 8 inches in height of plain block or concrete will be accepted above ground unless approved by the ABR or is an alteration to an existing condition.
- b. Painted or stained block or concrete will not be accepted unless approved by ABR,
- c. Exposed block or concrete greater than 8 inches in heights shall be:
 - Covered with brick or stone facing,
 - ii. Split face or other integrally textured and colored block or concrete,
 - iii. Other architecturally enhanced covering approved by ABR.




