MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

I would like to start by thanking the Fire Department, Lake County Red Cross and volunteers from Parker Hannifin and Oatey Co. for their hard work bringing Operation Sound the Alarm to Willoughby Hills last Friday. This group installed over 100 smoke detectors in 40 residences to keep our City safer. The smoke detectors installed by the Fire Department and the Red Cross volunteers have a 10-year battery life, so these homes will be safer for the next decade! If your smoke detectors are more than 10 years old or if you need (or know someone that needs) smoke detectors in their home, the City wants to help. Simply call the Fire Department at 440-942-7207, and they will help coordinate installation of new smoke detectors where they are needed.

Tomorrow is Electronics Recycling Day. From 9:00 AM until Noon, you can drop off your old electronics at City Hall. Most items are accepted free of charge including: PC's, phones, stereos, computer routers, keyboards and VCR/DVD players. CRT Monitors and TVs can be recycled for \$20.00 each while Printers cost \$10.00. Greenboard IT, our recycling company is committed to fully sanitizing any data that may remain on the devices and has a zero landfill policy, so this is a great way to safely dispose of your old electronics. Don't forget to keep gathering any items that you would like to shred as Shred Day will be June 3 at the Shoppes of Willoughby Hills Plaza.

Our Road Program is in full swing. The City's Service Department is working their way through the City repairing damaged areas on our City streets. We are continuing the rejuvenation process we have been using for the last several years. This process restores some of the materials in the asphalt that burn off during road construction, making the road stronger and last longer. Legend Lane, which was resurfaced last summer, was rejuvenated this week. Pleasant Valley Road (west of the historic bridge) has been under construction over the last 2 weeks. The final course was installed on May 11 and the berm installed on May 16. They will paint the lines on the road to wrap-up the project before the end of the month. As I have mentioned in the past, much of our 2023 road funds are committed to the resurfacing of Chardon Road from SOM Center Road to Bishop Road. That project is scheduled for next year, however, ODOT, who is handling the project, requires the City to make its contribution to the project this year.

Trivia Night in Willoughby Hills set a new record Tuesday evening with 11 teams competing. We hope to continue to grow this program, so please mark your calendar for 7:00 PM on the third Tuesday of each month and plan to join the competition. Here are a couple of sample questions from this week's competition:

- What Flower is recognized as the Memorial Day Flower?
- What Famous food brand traces its roots to a chain of restaurants and hotels founded in Cleveland in the early 1900's?

OPEN POSITION AND TESTING FOR FULL TIME POLICE OFFICER

The City of Willoughby Hills has an open Civil Service Test for the position of Full-Time Police Officer - testing date range is from 05/17/2023 - 06/07/2023.

Willoughby Hills Police Department offers full testing services for the position of Police Officer through National Testing Network (NTN). To register with NTN and schedule a test, go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, select 'Find Jobs', then select Law Enforcement Jobs and sign up for the Willoughby Hills Police Department.

When you visit the www.nationaltestingnetwork.com website:

- * Complete the NTN registration process and schedule your test.
- * Review all information related to the Willoughby Hills Police Department (Patrol Officer) including minimum requirements, salary, and benefits.
- * Review detailed information about the testing process.
- * Review the Frequently Asked Questions and take an online practice test (if desired).

Upon completion of your scheduled exam, scores are automatically forwarded to the Willoughby Hills Police Department. Candidates who attain a passing score on the entry level exam will be placed on the City of Willoughby Hills eligibility list. The Willoughby Hills Police Department will contact candidates on the list and will invite them to participate in further stages of the selection process.

National Testing Network is a service provided to conduct entry level testing in a standardized, professional environment. National Testing Network does not replace the City of Willoughby Hills responsibility and decision making in the testing process. All candidate results are provided to the City of Willoughby Hills where the final decisions are made.



On Wednesday, May 9, 2023 members from Willoughby Hills Fire Rescue traveled to Charlotte, Michigan to the Spartan Emergency Response Fire Truck Manufacture to look over the chassis for their new rescue fire engine.

Chief Gandee, Lt. DiMattia, Fd/Pm Lucic and Martin met with Jesse Sopko from Johnson's Emergency Vehicle Solutions and the Spartan staff.

Thank you to Fire Truck Audit/Inspection Lead, Andy Torrence, for taking his afternoon to take us through the chassis and the outstanding tour of the entire manufacturing campus. It was very impressive!

The chassis will next go to Brandon, South Dakota to have the rear body assembled and mounted to the chassis. Expected completion is July of this year. Spartan has done an outstanding job with sticking to their 440 day estimate.

ARCHITECTURAL BOARD OF REVIEW GUIDELINES

Below is a list of the updated Architectural Design Guidelines as discussed at the March 16th Planning Commission—Architectural Board of Review Meeting. Architectural Board of Review Design Guidelines

Date: 03/17/2023

Purpose

- a. Protect and preserve the appearance and character of the community,
- b. Protect the desirable characteristics and promote the stability of existing buildings,
- c. Promote the use of quality materials and construction practices to maintain and grow the value of investments in the community.

2. Architectural Style

- Style, materials, and colors of building alterations and accessory structures shall match principal building.
- b. Trim, minimum 4 inches wide, shall be provided around all doors and windows unless otherwise approved by the ABR.
- c. Masonry facing along front building elevation shall return a minimum 24 inches around corners unless approved by ABR.

3. Masonry Aboveground

- a. No more than 8 inches in height of plain block or concrete will be accepted above ground unless approved by the ABR or is an alteration to an existing condition.
- b. Painted or stained block or concrete will not be accepted unless approved by ABR,
- c. Exposed block or concrete greater than 8 inches in heights shall be:
 - i. Covered with brick or stone facing,
 - ii. Split face or other integrally textured and colored block or concrete,
 - iii. Other architecturally enhanced covering approved by ABR.

Please note that the Fire Department will be flushing hydrants over the next couple of months. The time and day this is occurs is dependent upon a few factors such as weather, available staff, and emergency calls. Thank you.

PLEASE NOTE:

From the Fire Department:

With the weather turning warmer, people will want to have outdoor fires.

It is important to note that the burning of yard waste is prohibited.

Thankfully, we have curbside yard waste pickup that allows for an alternative to burning materials.

POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM

The Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting. It was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

Season Pass (up to age 59) Resident cost would be \$85 (City pays \$50)

Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) Resident cost would be \$75 (City pays \$60)

The City of Willoughby Hills will be invoiced for the difference of each pass purchased. Please call the Mayor's Office at 440-918-8730 if you have any questions regarding this program.

SUMMER BLOCK PARTIES

The City of Willoughby Hills encourages Block Parties in the community in order for neighbors to get to know each other and enjoy living in the City.

The City is committed to assist residents who plan a Block Party in their neighborhood by: Providing barriers to block off the street during the event, arranging for a representative from the City's Police, Fire, or Service Department to make an appearance at the event (often times with a treat bag for the kids), arranging for the Mayor or Council member to visit in order to allow the guests to become familiar with their representatives, providing information for your menu planning with contacts from Willoughby Hills businesses, and finally to provide an alternate location at one of the City's Campbell Park pavilions if your street would prohibit or make such a gathering difficult.

YARD WASTE SERVICE INFORMATION FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.


