MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

I wanted to focus on a few important safety issues this week. First off, you may have noticed the haze and even the smell of burning wood in the air in our City. This is the result of the significant forest fires currently burning in Canada. Today marks almost 20 days without rain in the Cleveland area. With these drier than normal conditions the risk of grass and mulch fires has significantly increased. Please avoid all outdoor burning, including recreational fires, as we want to avoid the potential of any damaging fires in our City. The Fire Department has already responded to several fires that have unfortunately spread from smaller controlled fires into larger fires.

Also, from the fire department, please take a look at the Fire Department's Facebook posting from this week regarding safety while pumping gas. The post emphasizes the importance of remaining with your car in case there is an equipment issue that could result in a fuel spill or worse.

As you may have already seen, earlier this week our Police Department interrupted the attempted theft of several Kia and Hyundai automobiles. Car thieves preying on these vehicles have returned to the area. The Police Department has a large stock of the steering wheel locks available for any resident that is a Kia or Hyundai owner. To obtain one, simply come up to the Police Department window at City Hall with proof of ownership, and a copy of your vehicle title or lease, and a steering wheel lock will be provided to you. During the last string of break-ins, vehicles that had a steering wheel lock were left untouched, while those that did not have the locks were broken into by the auto thieves.

The Service Department's street repair program is moving through the City, currently working on River Road. Please keep an eye out for our Service workers while you are driving and approach any areas under repair slowly and carefully.

Finally, with respect to the safety of your personal information, I am very happy to report that almost 120 residents took advantage of our Shred Day event last Saturday at the Shoppes of Willoughby Hills. I'm very grateful to the Ray Somich for providing music and entertainment during the event and for the many local businesses that attended to offer refreshments and share information about their businesses. For those of you who weren't able to participate last week, another Shred Day is being planned for this fall. We are also planning another electronics recycling day in the fall. Keep an eye out for information in future City newsletters.

In order to

pick one up at the Willoughby Hills Police Department, the following is required:

- Proof of residency in Willoughby Hills.
- Proof of ownership of a Kia or Hyundai vehicle.

These will be distributed to residents as long as there is stock available.

Summer 2023 Information





Please note that the Fire Department will be flushing hydrants over the next couple of months. The time and day this is occurs is dependent upon a few factors such as weather, available staff, and emergency calls. Thank you.

PLEASE NOTE:

From the Fire Department:

With the weather turning warmer, people will want to have outdoor fires.

It is important to note that the burning of yard waste is prohibited.

Thankfully, we have curbside yard waste pickup that allows for an alternative to burning materials.

POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM

The Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting. It was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

Season Pass (up to age 59) Resident cost would be \$85 (City pays \$50) Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) Resident cost would be \$75 (City pays \$60)

The City of Willoughby Hills will be invoiced for the difference of each pass purchased. Please call the Mayor's Office at 440-918-8730 if you have any questions regarding this program.

SUMMER BLOCK PARTIES

The City of Willoughby Hills encourages Block Parties in the community in order for neighbors to get to know each other and enjoy living in the City.

The City is committed to assist residents who plan a Block Party in their neighborhood by: Providing barriers to block off the street during the event, arranging for a representative from the City's Police, Fire, or Service Department to make an appearance at the event (often times with a treat bag for the kids), arranging for the Mayor or Council member to visit in order to allow the guests to become familiar with their representatives, providing information for your menu planning with contacts from Willoughby Hills businesses, and finally to provide an alternate location at one of the City's Campbell Park pavilions if your street would prohibit or make such a gathering difficult.

YARD WASTE SERVICE INFORMATION FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

*PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PRICE OF YELLOW TRASH BAGS HAS INCREASED. THEY ARE NOW \$40.50 FOR A ROLL OF 10. THANK YOU!

In partnership with Cuyahoga Soil & Water Conservation District and Lake County Soil & Water Conservation District, Chagrin River Watershed Partners (CRWP) will again be offering the **Master Rain Gardener certification course** for residents and professionals within Northeast Ohio. They would like to share this opportunity directly with their member communities, especially with any neighborhoods that may be experiencing flooding issues.

Rain gardens are saucer-shaped gardens filled with native, wet-tolerant plants that capture and soak in rainwater that runs off impervious surfaces like roofs, lawns, and driveways. They filter out the pollutants that would otherwise flow into our storm drains and streams untreated. When replicated across the residential landscape, rain gardens can make a significant impact in protecting the water quality of our local streams and Lake Erie.

This program will consist of 5 classes over a 6-week period. Participants will learn how to design, install, and maintain residential rain gardens. This course offers two track options: one for residential rain gardeners, and one for professionals. The **residential certification** track is geared toward homeowners who would like to install a rain garden in their own yard. This also enables them to serve as the neighborhood expert on rain gardens! The **professional certification** track is geared toward landscape professionals and contractors looking to install rain gardens professionally on residential properties.

This summer in-person course will begin on July 6.

Registration is now open!
