MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

Happy Friday Willoughby Hills! A few items to report on as Summer officially begins:

The Fire Department recently became the first in Lake County to obtain individual thermal-imaging cameras for every member of the on-duty staff. Each of these devices is about 2" x 5" and can be easily carried by our firefighters at an incident. The cameras will allow them to evaluate potentially unsafe fire conditions and also assist in searching fire scenes for potential victims and searching building for hidden fire conditions. Fire Lieutenant Lou DiMattia told me that this is one of the five most revolutionary changes in the fire service since he started his career here. Fire Chief Gandee explained that the first thermal-imaging devices (helmet mounted cameras) cost tens of thousands of dollars and were very bulky. It is truly amazing that they are now both small enough and affordable enough to be part of each firefighter's protective equipment.

Chief Gandee also let me know that our new Command Vehicle is finishing its updating in the next few days and will be in service shortly thereafter. Look for photos and an article in a future edition of the Newsletter.

Our Service Department team is out working on the roads. They have been on Maplegrove, Eagle, Dodds Hill and River Road recently. For the next several weeks, they will continue working to patch damaged sections of the roads and then return to seal the edges of their repairs. Please slow down and pass them with caution when you see them at work!

Thanks to Service Superintendent Mark Grubiss for installing siding on parts of City Hall and the Fire Station this week. The siding covers areas that are harder to reach where the paint has worn off. Mark will be continuing this project in the coming weeks and will then be painting the buildings where needed. A second rail will be installed on the entrance steps to City Hall in the next few weeks as well.

Last night Council approved legislation to replace three Police Department vehicles with new Dodge Durango SUVs to replace existing vehicles in our fleet. With these purchases we will have turned over all of our front-line vehicles since 2020 and added one to support the new officers that we have added to the Police Department this year. I am very grateful to Police Chief Naegele, Captain Greg Leonbruno and Court Officer Jim Ours for their hard work to secure the necessary vehicles to provide the best equipment possible for our officers and residents.

If you are a photographer (or just have the opportunity to take a cool photo this summer), don't forget that the 2023 Willoughby Hills Recreation Photo Contest will be taking entries this year! The categories this year are: "Working in Willoughby Hills", "Go Green", "Windows and Glass" and "Fundamentally Family". More details will appear in future newsletters. Submissions are due November 4th and the Reception and announcement of winners will be November 10th.

LAKE COUNTY GENERAL HEALTH DISTRICT OFFICIALS EXPECTING AN INCREASE IN MOSQUITOS









With the recent rains and arrival of warm weather, LCGHD officials are expecting an increase in the number of mosquitos in Lake County. The rains over the past few weeks have left large areas of standing water where mosquitos typically lay their eggs. "The best advice is to get rid of standing water around your house if you can, and use personal protection against mosquitoes," noted Bert Mechenbier, Supervisor of Mosquito Control at LCGHD.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS

-Lightning Safety Awareness Week June 18-24-

Lightning is one of the leading causes of injury and death from weather-related hazards. From the Ohio Committee for Severe Weather Awareness, the following information can help keep you and your family safe from the storm.

- Be weather aware. If the weather forecast calls for thunderstorms, consider postponing your trip or outdoor activity.
- Know the difference between a Thunderstorm Watch (Be Prepared) and a Thunderstorm Warning (Take Action!)
- "When thunder roars, go indoors!" Stop outdoor activities and seek a safe, enclosed shelter immediately. This includes all water activities.
- Suspend outdoor activities for at least 30 minutes after hearing the last clap of thunder.
- If shelter from the storm is not available, crouch down low, with as little of your body touching the ground as possible. Lightning can cause electric currents along the top of the ground that can be deadly up to, and exceeding, 100 feet away.

Prepare Before the Storm:

- Know your area's risk for lightning. Spring and summer are typical seasons for thunderstorms, though they can occur year-round and at any hour.
- Sign up for your local emergency notification system or download a weather app. The Emergency Alert System and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio also provide emergency alerts.
- Consider buying surge protectors, lightning rods, or a lightning protection system to protect your home, appliances, and electronic devices.

Survive During the Storm:

If a thunderstorm warning has been issued for your area or you hear thunder, go inside immediately.

- Get out and away from bodies of water. If boating, fishing, or swimming, get to land and find a sturdy, grounded shelter or vehicle immediately.
- If indoors, avoid running water or using landline phones. Electricity can travel through plumbing and telephone lines.
- Protect your property. Unplug appliances and other electric devices.

Be Safe After the Storm:


- Watch for fallen power lines or broken tree limbs. Report hazards immediately.
- If power outages occur, report them to your utility provider. Don't wait for a neighbor to report the outage.
- If using alternate power sources like a generator, always follow the manufacturer's directions.

In order to pick one up at the Willoughby Hills Police Department, the following is required:

- Proof of residency in Willoughby Hills.
- Proof of ownership of a Kia or Hyundai vehicle.

These will be distributed to residents as long as there is stock available.

Summer 2023 Information





Please note that the Fire Department will be flushing hydrants over the next couple of months. The time and day this is occurs is dependent upon a few factors such as weather, available staff, and emergency calls. Thank you.

PLEASE NOTE:

From the Fire Department:

With the weather turning warmer, people will want to have outdoor fires.

It is important to note that the burning of yard waste is prohibited.

Thankfully, we have curbside yard waste pickup that allows for an alternative to burning materials.

POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM

The Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting. It was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

Season Pass (up to age 59) Resident cost would be \$85 (City pays \$50) Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) Resident cost would be \$75 (City pays \$60)

The City of Willoughby Hills will be invoiced for the difference of each pass purchased. Please call the Mayor's Office at 440-918-8730 if you have any questions regarding this program.

SUMMER BLOCK PARTIES

The City of Willoughby Hills encourages Block Parties in the community in order for neighbors to get to know each other and enjoy living in the City.

The City is committed to assist residents who plan a Block Party in their neighborhood by: Providing barriers to block off the street during the event, arranging for a representative from the City's Police, Fire, or Service Department to make an appearance at the event (often times with a treat bag for the kids), arranging for the Mayor or Council member to visit in order to allow the guests to become familiar with their representatives, providing information for your menu planning with contacts from Willoughby Hills businesses, and finally to provide an alternate location at one of the City's Campbell Park pavilions if your street would prohibit or make such a gathering difficult.

YARD WASTE SERVICE INFORMATION FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.






