

With the recent rains and arrival of warm weather, LCGHD officials are expecting an increase in the number of mosquitos in Lake County. The rains over the past few weeks have left large areas of standing water where mosquitos typically lay their eggs. "The best advice is to get rid of standing water around your house if you can, and use personal protection against mosquitoes," noted Bert Mechenbier, Supervisor of Mosquito Control at LCGHD.

NEWSLETTER – July 14, 2023 EDITOR'S REPORT:

Willoughby Hills Seniors, Inc. is happy to provide this newsletter to you as a way to stay engaged in senior activities in our community.

This month's Senior Potluck on Tuesday, July 18 at 11:30 a.m. is Attorney Joyce Hribar Fiebig. Joyce is an estate planning attorney who can assist seniors in preparing wills, living trusts and other important documents, such as Power of Attorney. Her business is located at 33977 Chardon Road in Willoughby Hills. Our main entrée will be sausage and peppers (yum!). We hope you will join us on Tuesday, July 18<sup>th</sup>! If you haven't joined Willoughby Hills Seniors yet, there's still time to fill out your application to become a member. Pick up an application in the Senior Room or on the City website at: <u>www.willoughbyhills-oh.gov</u>. Fee is \$7 for one member, or \$10 for a couple.

The Senior Board is truly trying to obtain the myseniorcenter.com system from the Lake County Commissioners, similar to what other Lake County cities have received through the Lake County Senior Levy funding. Despite paying into the Senior Levy fund, Willoughby Hills residents have not received the benefits for their Senior Center since previous applications required a full-time director, which Willoughby Hills does not have. This rule was changed but the City was not made aware that they were able to apply for this funding until recently. We now want the same system that others have gotten. It tracks membership for people coming and going for the various programs in the senior center and will provide the County with this information for future funding. The Board presented their request to City Council on Monday night at the Working Committee of Council and they agreed that we will attempt to get this item for our seniors. We will be asking for help from all of our seniors to write letters to the Commissioners or come to a meeting to let them know how important this is to us. We will continue updates in the newsletter as things progress.

I have gotten a few emails from residents who are looking for some assistance with tasks they can no longer do on their own. You may recall that the City started the W.H.I.S.P.E.R. program until Mayor Weger's administration which can help our seniors. Please visit the City website to get an application to get assistance, or volunteer to help with the program.

There will be some information in the next newsletter regarding the HEAP Program which provides funding for electric bills for eligible customers. There are certain income thresholds but also medical conditions that will be shared with you to see if you may be eligible for this county program.

The Willoughby Hills Quilt Guild continues to make quilts for the community through the Community Quilts group that meets on the second Monday of each month in the Senior Room. Everyone is welcome to join the fun and if you know of anyone who may be recovering from an illness and in need of a lap quilt, please let us know and we will be happy to do what we can to make this happen. The WH Quilt Guild meets on the third Thursday of each month in the Senior Room. They will be displaying their beautiful work at the Community Center, with a special reception on Friday, September 8 at 7pm in the foyer, where quilts will be hung for the entire month.

Classic Lexus in Willoughby Hills is preparing for the annual Classic 5k Run/Walk which is set for Sunday, October 8 at Classic Lexus on Som Center Road. Registration begins at 8am and the run begins at 9am, with the walk to follow. This is a pet-friendly event and an adoption agency will be on hand if you are in the market for a furry friend! This is a great community event, with all proceeds going to St. Noel Food Pantry and Velosano Childhood Cancer Research Organization. Each runner brings a canned good, too, which truly helps fill the pantry at St. Noel. Raffle baskets are available too so you can even come to check those out even if you are not a runner! Put this on your calendar...it is so much fun and a great way to give back to the community.

The Senior Group is planning to sponsor a few families during the Christmas holiday. If you know of someone who may be in need, please get their name to the Senior Board before December 15. We are planning to do a holiday craft, too, which will help you with your holiday gift giving.

The Senior Board presented Council with their Comprehensive Plan at the 7/10/23 Working Committee of Council meeting (in addition to their request for the Senior Registration software). It included programs, room amenities and other items that will make our Senior Room a nice place to go. In closing, please know that we are continuing to bring some nice programs and cleaning up the Senior Room. We have reached out to Council for funding allocation and hope our dream may soon become a reality. (I have been very diligent in buying Powerball tickets from Rodney at Dynamic Duo in the hopes that we can accomplish everything in one full swoop!! Will keep you posted)!

It appears the hot temperatures are going to continue. Make it a point to hydrate and be smart when planning to work outdoors!



# YARD WASTE SERVICE INFORMATION

# FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS

### YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

## YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers</u>\* must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (\*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

## DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
  - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

# **UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

# **SNOW PLOW REGISTRATION**

June 1st began the new year for snow plow registration. Registration IS required if you plan to remove snow from private driveways or private parking areas in the City during the 2023-2024 winter season. Cost to register is \$25.00 for the first vehicle and \$5.00 for each additional vehicle. Registration is required annually (expiring May 31, 2024) and there is no prorating of registration fees. Please note that the Fire Department will be flushing hydrants over the next couple of months. The time and day this is occurs is dependent upon a few factors such as weather, available staff, and emergency calls. Thank you.

# **POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM**

The Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting. It was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

#### Season Pass (up to age 59) Resident cost would be \$85 (City pays \$50)

#### Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) Resident cost would be \$75 (City pays \$60)

The City of Willoughby Hills will be invoiced for the difference of each pass purchased. Please call the Mayor's Office at 440-918-8730 if you have any questions regarding this program.

## **SUMMER BLOCK PARTIES**

The City of Willoughby Hills encourages Block Parties in the community in order for neighbors to get to know each other and enjoy living in the City.

The City is committed to assist residents who plan a Block Party in their neighborhood by: Providing barriers to block off the street during the event, arranging for a representative from the City's Police, Fire, or Service Department to make an appearance at the event (often times with a treat bag for the kids), arranging for the Mayor or Council member to visit in order to allow the guests to become familiar with their representatives, providing information for your menu planning with contacts from Willoughby Hills businesses, and finally to provide an alternate location at one of the City's Campbell Park pavilions if your street would prohibit or make such a gathering difficult.


