MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

Good Afternoon Willoughby Hills!

We are just over a week away from Music Fest 2023! As I mentioned in last week's newsletter, thanks to the hard work of the Music Fest Committee, we have a wonderful day of music, food and entertainment planned for you! We are still looking for a few entries to round out the Car Show. Please see the application later in this Newsletter.

Congratulations to Lieutenant Patty Heller on her retirement from Willoughby Hills Fire Rescue. Patty served the residents of Willoughby Hills and Waite Hill for 33 years as a Firefighter/ Paramedic, Lieutenant and as Acting Chief. On Wednesday, the Fire Department hosted a Luncheon in Patty's honor. It was great to see many current and retired Willoughby Hills Fire Rescue personnel and other City Staff attend as well as Patty's colleagues from Gates Mills, Willoughby and other area Fire Departments. City Council and the Mayor's Office will be presenting Patty with a Resolution and a Proclamation recognizing her service and many accomplishments at the September 28, 2023 Council meeting. If you see Patty around, please thank her for her distinguished service to the City and join me in congratulating her on her retirement.

While the Fire Department was honoring Patty, the East Side Technical Rescue Team was behind the Fire Department conducting trench rescue training and building collapse training. Thanks to Service Superintendent Mark Grubiss for assisting with digging the trenches and providing materials for the building collapse training. The East Side Technical Rescue Team is composed of area Fire Departments (including Willoughby Hills) who each contribute team members and equipment to train for and respond to special rescue situations including water rescue, trench rescue, rope rescue, confined space rescue and building collapses.

Photo Enforcement Cameras were installed in the School Zone in front of Cornerstone Christian Academy this week. In the coming weeks, the Police Department will be providing you with information about the new photo enforcement program both in our City's School Zones and on our streets and highways (see the flyer later in this newsletter).

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) has been upgrading lighting along Interstates throughout Ohio, including Interstates 90 and 271 here in Willoughby Hills. The brighter lights have been noteworthy on the highways, but the lights have also spilled additional light over into some of the neighborhoods adjacent to the Interstates. I have spoken with ODOT representatives and they are ordering additional equipment to help limit the spread of the lighting onto adjacent properties. They will start installing the equipment as soon as it is delivered.

Finally, thanks to Communications Supervisor Karen Mehollin, Service Clerk Stacey Rentz and Supt. Grubiss for coordinating the replacement of the benches in front of the Community Center. They look great and will be a great place to enjoy the Community Center for years to come.



Traffic Safety Enforcement Program

Each year, too many families are affected by crashes caused by speeding. Sadly, the victims of traffic crashes are often occupants of other vehicles who have fallen victim to speeding and careless driving.

Improving traffic safety for residents and visitors is a strategic goal of the Willoughby Hills Police Department. That is why I am so pleased to report that we are implementing a photo enforcement system in Willoughby Hills. The state of the art system is designed to help us encourage safer driving habits and save lives.

Our police officers cannot enforce traffic laws everywhere, all the time. The new enforcement system will allow us to enforce traffic laws in a safer way for the officer and the violator. There are no upfront costs to the taxpayers and, over time, violators will fund this program.

I encourage you to respect the rules of the road – help keep yourself and your neighbors safe and sound. Join me in supporting our new traffic enforcement system.

Question & Answer



There will be a warning period for the first 30 days, after the program begins.

Is speeding a public safety concern?

According to the IIHS, speeding is a factor in one-third of all fatal crashes in the U.S., killing more than 10,000 people per year. In addition, according to the NHTSA, speed-related crashes cost the U.S. economy approximately \$40 billion per year.

How will the new Speed Enforcement Program work to protect lives in Willoughby Hills?

This Traffic Enforcement Program will protect lives by reminding motorists to slowdown and obey speed laws. Automated safety cameras will identify motorists who are breaking the law by exceeding the speed limits. The registered owner of the violating vehicle will receive a traffic citation in the mail.

What systems will the police department be using?

The Willoughby Hills Police Department will be utilizing handheld and fixed location photo enforcement equipment. In school zones, we have set up fixed location cameras to capture vehicles traveling at an unsafe speed in an effort to keep our children safer. These will be operational only on school days during school hours. The handheld equipment will be used by certified police officers in multiple locations along the interstate and other roadways in the community. The system will be used to identify and ticket speeding vehicles in a manner that is potentially safer for the officer and occupants of the vehicle.

Does someone double-check the evidence?

Sworn police officers will determine violations. Our vendor will do the initial screenings of information for photo and data quality. Officers will review every violation to verify vehicle information and ensure the vehicle is in violation. These officers will utilize the same standards for photo enforcement as they would with a standard violation event. Upon officer approval, a citation will be mailed to the vehicle owner. The owner will then have the right to pay the citation or exercise a contest process.

What are the Traffic Enforcement fines in the City of Willoughby Hills?

Speed Over	Fine Amount Owed	Fine if in a Construction or School Zone
1-19 MPH	\$150.00	\$150.00
20-29 MPH	\$200.00	\$200.00
30+ MPH	\$300.00	\$300.00

Are automated enforcement cameras legal?

Yes. Courts have ruled in favor of a municipality's right to use automated enforcement technology in a fair and judicious manner.

Will people know when they are entering a School enforcement zone?

Yes. Signs will be posted at every enforced zone, warning drivers that photo enforcement is in use ahead.

Can I challenge my citation?

Yes. Each citation ticket contains detailed information on how to exercise your due process rights and contest the citation.

What about privacy? Will I be photographed in my vehicle?

No. Vehicles following traffic laws are not photographed. Additionally, the driver is not visible on the citation.

Rogers Road Slope Repair:



This is an upcoming retaining wall project alongside the Chagrin

River just north of the Rogers Road bridge. The design is expected to be finalized by 8/9/23. Construction start date has been tentatively pushed back to mid-September due to supply issues. Both lanes of traffic will likely be closed throughout construction with detours provided.



RABIES BAITING IN LAKE COUNTY TO BEGIN ON JULY 31st





Beginning July 31, 2023, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) and other agencies will partner with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service Wildlife Services Program to immunize wild raccoons, skunks, foxes, and coyotes to help stop the spread of rabies. They will vaccinate them through oral rabies vaccine (ORV) baits. ORV baits may be distributed by airplane, helicopter, or by car. In Lake County, the area along the Ashtabula County border will

YARD WASTE SERVICE INFORMATION FOR WILLOUGHBY HILLS RESIDENTS

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

*PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PRICE OF YELLOW TRASH BAGS HAS INCREASED. THEY ARE NOW \$40.50 FOR A ROLL OF 10. THANK YOU!

SNOW PLOW REGISTRATION

June 1st began the new year for snow plow registration. Registration IS required if you plan to remove snow from private driveways or private parking areas in the City during the 2023-2024 winter season. Cost to register is \$25.00 for the first vehicle and \$5.00 for each additional vehicle. Registration is required annually (expiring May 31, 2024) and there is no prorating of registration fees.

POOL SUBSIDY PROGRAM

The Recreation Commission set the City of Willoughby Pool Subsidy Rate at their April 5th meeting. It was then approved by Council at their April 13th meeting. Subsidy rates are as follows:

Season Pass (up to age 59) Resident cost would be \$85 (City pays \$50) Season Pass (for Seniors 60+) Resident cost would be \$75 (City pays \$60)




