## **Rogers Road Closure UPDATE:**

Rogers Road will be closed to traffic (both lanes) on Tuesday, September 5th, for approximately 4 weeks in order to facilitate construction of a retaining wall project alongside the Chagrin River. The nearest address to the closure location is 37000 Rogers Road. Traffic will be detoured through River Road, Chardon Road, and Worrell Road. All private drive entrances will remain open. Schirmer Construction will be performing the work. Please plan accordingly.


WILLOUGHBY HILLS (Friday, August 25, 2023) - The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is proposing to resurface US-6 (Chardon Rd) between SR-91 (Som Center Rd) and SR-84 (Bishop Rd).

This project is a follow-up to the 2022 project which involved resurfacing Chardon Rd. east of Som Center Rd. Construction is tentatively scheduled to be completed between March and October of 2024. Detailed project schedule information will be refined in Spring 2024.

During construction, Chardon Rd is expected to be open to westbound traffic only. Eastbound traffic will be detoured through Eddy Rd. via Bishop Rd., Rockefeller Rd., and Som Center Rd. To reduce the impact on traffic, the project is being planned for construction in two phases. During the first phase, the portion of Chardon Rd. between Bishop Rd. and Rockefeller Rd. will be resurfaced. During the second phase, the portion of Chardon Rd. between Rockefeller Rd. and Som Center Rd. will be resurfaced.

The estimated construction cost is \$1.4 million.

That is why I am so pleased to report that we are implementing a photo enforcement system in Willoughby Hills. The state of the art system is designed to help us encourage safer driving habits and save lives.

Our police officers cannot enforce traffic laws everywhere, all the time. The new enforcement system will allow us to enforce traffic laws in a safer way for the officer and the violator. There are no upfront costs to the taxpayers and, over time, violators will fund this program.

I encourage you to respect the rules of the road – help keep yourself and your neighbors safe and sound. Join me in supporting our new traffic enforcement system.

## Question & Answer



There will be a warning period for the first 30 days, after the program begins.

#### Is speeding a public safety concern?

According to the IIHS, speeding is a factor in one-third of all fatal crashes in the U.S., killing more than 10,000 people per year. In addition, according to the NHTSA, speed-related crashes cost the U.S. economy approximately \$40 billion per year.

## How will the new Speed Enforcement Program work to protect lives in Willoughby Hills?

This Traffic Enforcement Program will protect lives by reminding motorists to slowdown and obey speed laws. Automated safety cameras will identify motorists who are breaking the law by exceeding the speed limits. The registered owner of the violating vehicle will receive a traffic citation in the mail.

### What systems will the police department be using?

The Willoughby Hills Police Department will be utilizing handheld and fixed location photo enforcement equipment. In school zones, we have set up fixed location cameras to capture vehicles traveling at an unsafe speed in an effort to keep our children safer. These will be operational only on school days during school hours. The handheld equipment will be used by certified police officers in multiple locations along the interstate and other roadways in the community. The system will be used to identify and ticket speeding vehicles in a manner that is potentially safer for the officer and occupants of the vehicle.

#### Does someone double-check the evidence?

Sworn police officers will determine violations. Our vendor will do the initial screenings of information for photo and data quality. Officers will review every violation to verify vehicle information and ensure the vehicle is in violation. These officers will utilize the same standards for photo enforcement as they would with a standard violation event. Upon officer approval, a citation will be mailed to the vehicle owner. The owner will then have the right to pay the citation or exercise a contest process.

#### What are the Traffic Enforcement fines in the City of Willoughby Hills?

Speed Over	Fine Amount Owed	Fine if in a Construction or School Zone
1-19 MPH	\$150.00	\$150.00
20-29 MPH	\$200.00	\$200.00
30+ MPH	\$300.00	\$300.00

## Are automated enforcement cameras legal?

Yes. Courts have ruled in favor of a municipality's right to use automated enforcement technology in a fair and judicious manner.

## Will people know when they are entering a School enforcement zone?

Yes. Signs will be posted at every enforced zone, warning drivers that photo enforcement is in use ahead.

#### Can I challenge my citation?

Yes. Each citation ticket contains detailed information on how to exercise your due process rights and contest the citation.

## What about privacy? Will I be photographed in my vehicle?

No. Vehicles following traffic laws are not photographed. Additionally, the driver is not visible on the citation.

# ARE YOU OK PROGRAM

Keeping Lake County Seniors Safe



The Are You OK Program is an automated monitoring call that provides added security and eases the concern of friends and family who are concerned about their loved one's safety.

Calls are made at a pre-arranged time each day. If the check-in call is not answered after three attempts, a safety alert is given to Lifeline.

Lifeline will contact the provided emergency contacts and, if necessary, local law enforcement for a well-check.

## **WHO QUALIFIES**

- Lake County Seniors (60+)
- Reside independently in Lake County, but are isolated or living alone
- A safety lock box is required to participate in the program.

## YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

## YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers\*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (\*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

## DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

## SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
  - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

## **UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

The Ohio Afterschool Child Enrichment (ACE) Educational Savings Account program provides funds to a student's parent or guardian to use on various enrichment and educational activities. The program is being offered through a contract between Merit International, Inc. and the Ohio Department of Education.

## Here's how it works for parents, guardians, students and service providers.



Step 1

#### Complete the Application

Follow along the ACE Application Step-by-Step Guide for a walkthrough on the process of applying for ACE funds. This involves creating an OH|ID account, requesting access to the Ohio ACE application and how to apply for the ACE Savings Account.



Step 2

#### Sign Up with Merit

After completing the Ohio ACE application (this entire process may take up to two weeks), qualifying parents and guardians will receive an email from Merit notifying them to sign up to receive access to their account funds. The email also will include a link to the Education Marketplace.



Step 3

#### Spend ACE Funds with Qualified Education Service Providers

Parents and guardians will be able to access the Education Marketplace to find providers in their areas after the account has been set up with Merit on ACEOhio.org.
