Good afternoon, Willoughby Hills. It's hard to believe that we've reached September already.

Touch-A-Truck is only two weeks from tomorrow. The planning committee met yesterday and we are expecting a great variety of vehicles from area fire departments, law enforcement and our own service department. The event will begin at 10:00 AM. In addition to the many vehicles on display, there will also be food, games provided by the Recreation Commission, a medical helicopter, the Willoughby-Eastlake Public Library, and a demonstration by the Fire Department of how a victim is extricated from a damaged vehicle following an accident. One note to those who might be planning to play pickleball or use Campbell Park that morning, please plan to park in the Eddy Road parking lot as there will be no traffic allowed through the main driveway during the Touch -A-Truck event.

Thanks again to our Fire Department, Police Department, and Service Department, as well as the City Hall team for their hard work following last week's storms. The Service Department spent much of this week finishing their cleanup work in the City. They will be coming around the City next week to pick up any tree limbs that Republic is unable to pick up as part of their Yard Waste program. Please place the limbs parallel with the street, so it is easier for the Service team to fit into the chipping machine.

In my report about Music Fest last week, I forgot to mention Kathy Sivo. Kathy serves on our recreation commission and was a member of the Music Fest planning committee. Kathy and her daughter Annie worked tirelessly all day welcoming you to the event as well as set up and clean up. Thanks so much Kathy and Annie for helping make Music Fest a great event. Rogers Road Closure UPDATE:

Rogers Road will be closed to traffic (both lanes) on Tuesday, September 5th, for approximately 4 weeks in order to facilitate construction of a retaining wall project alongside the Chagrin River. The nearest address to the closure location is 37000 Rogers Road. Traffic will be detoured through River Road, Chardon Road, and Worrell Road. All private drive entrances will remain open. Schirmer Construction will be performing the work. Please plan accordingly.

Brush Pickup UPDATE:

Our Service Department has been working hard this week cleaning up storm damage and clearing the roadways. Beginning next week they will be out with the wood chipper assisting residents by picking up <u>STORM BRUSH ONLY</u>. They are asking that the brush be brought to the curb and facing the direction of travel (parallel to road) for fast and effective pick up. Thank you.



SNOW PLOW REGISTRATION

June 1st began the new year for snow plow registration. Registration IS required if you plan to remove snow from private driveways or private parking areas in the City during the 2023-2024 winter season. Cost to register is \$25.00 for the first vehicle and \$5.00 for each additional vehicle. Registration is required annually (expiring May 31, 2024) and there is no prorating of registration fees. <u>Press Release</u>

WILLOUGHBY HILLS (Friday, August 25, 2023) - The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is proposing to resurface US-6 (Chardon Rd) between SR-91 (Som Center Rd) and SR-84 (Bishop Rd).

This project is a follow-up to the 2022 project which involved resurfacing Chardon Rd. east of Som Center Rd. Construction is tentatively scheduled to be completed between March and October of 2024. Detailed project schedule information will be refined in Spring 2024.

During construction, Chardon Rd is expected to be open to westbound traffic only. Eastbound traffic will be detoured through Eddy Rd. via Bishop Rd., Rockefeller Rd., and Som Center Rd. To reduce the impact on traffic, the project is being planned for construction in two phases. During the first phase, the portion of Chardon Rd. between Bishop Rd. and Rockefeller Rd. will be resurfaced. During the second phase, the portion of Chardon Rd. between Rockefeller Rd. and Som Center Rd. will be resurfaced.

The estimated construction cost is \$1.4 million.

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEMS



Many people are commenting on how they didn't hear the tornado sirens Friday night. As we continually remind the public, the sirens are intended only to alert those who are OUTDOORS to go inside and seek further information (TV, radio, etc.). Additionally, this storm occurred at night while many people were sleeping which increased the potential danger. Most of us get cell


phone alerts for weather warnings and have weather apps but many of us do not wake up to our cell phones, which leads to our next recommendation: Having a NOAA Weather Radio in every home.

Weather radios work via VHF radio waves and alert immediately & automatically any time the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning. Other warnings can be added (severe thunderstorm, flash flood, etc.) and alerts can typically be customized by specific location. The example listed below is AC with battery back-up, has a display, and the audible alert tone is irritatingly LOUD (on purpose). They also make portable NOAA weather radios for various applications. Similar to smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, having a weather radio in your home may very well save a life.

Wireless Emergency Notification System (WENS)

In January 2021, the Lake County Emergency Management Agency upgraded their VESTA Alert system to the Wireless Emergency Notification System (WENS) to help notify our citizens during times of emergency. This system adds to the capability of reaching Lake County citizens with important emergency information through automated voice calls, text messages and e-mails. Residents may also opt to receive NOAA Weather Warnings (i.e. Severe Thunderstorm Warnings, Lake Effect Snow Warnings, etc.).

In order to receive this important information, all you have to do is make sure you're registered in our database. All residents of Lake County with a published landline telephone number, and those that signed up via the old VESTA self-registration portal, were imported into the new WENS system. Anyone that wishes to add, or update, their cell phone to receive emergency notification calls, text messages, emails or the optional weather alerts needs to provide their information <u>here</u>.

Traffic Safety Enforcement Program

Each year, too many families are affected by crashes caused by speeding. Sadly, the victims of traffic crashes are often occupants of other vehicles who have fallen victim to speeding and careless driving.

Improving traffic safety for residents and visitors is a strategic goal of the Willoughby Hills Police Department. That is why I am so pleased to report that we are implementing a photo enforcement system in Willoughby Hills. The state of the art system is designed to help us encourage safer driving habits and save lives. Our police officers cannot enforce traffic laws everywhere, all the time. The new enforcement system will allow us to enforce traffic laws in a safer way for the officer and the violator. There are no upfront costs to the taxpayers and, over time, violators will fund this program.

I encourage you to respect the rules of the road – help keep yourself and your neighbors safe and sound. Join me in supporting our new traffic enforcement system.

Question & Answer



There will be a warning period for the first 30 days, after the program begins.

Is speeding a public safety concern?

According to the IIHS, speeding is a factor in one-third of all fatal crashes in the U.S., killing more than 10,000 people per year. In addition, according to the NHTSA, speed-related crashes cost the U.S. economy approximately \$40 billion per year.

How will the new Speed Enforcement Program work to protect lives in Willoughby Hills?

This Traffic Enforcement Program will protect lives by reminding motorists to slowdown and obey speed laws. Automated safety cameras will identify motorists who are breaking the law by exceeding the speed limits. The registered owner of the violating vehicle will receive a traffic citation in the mail.

What systems will the police department be using?

The Willoughby Hills Police Department will be utilizing handheld and fixed location photo enforcement equipment. In school zones, we have set up fixed location cameras to capture vehicles traveling at an unsafe speed in an effort to keep our children safer. These will be operational only on school days during school hours. The handheld equipment will be used by certified police officers in multiple locations along the interstate and other roadways in the community. The system will be used to identify and ticket speeding vehicles in a manner that is potentially safer for the officer and occupants of the vehicle.

Does someone double-check the evidence?

Sworn police officers will determine violations. Our vendor will do the initial screenings of information for photo and data quality. Officers will review every violation to verify vehicle information and ensure the vehicle is in violation. These officers will utilize the same standards for photo enforcement as they would with a standard violation event. Upon officer approval, a citation will be mailed to the vehicle owner. The owner will then have the right to pay the citation or exercise a contest process.

What are the Traffic Enforcement fines in the City of Willoughby Hills?

Speed Over	Fine Amount Owed	Fine if in a Construction or School Zone
1-19 MPH	\$150.00	\$150.00
20-29 MPH	\$200.00	\$200.00
30+ MPH	\$300.00	\$300.00

Are automated enforcement cameras legal?

Yes. Courts have ruled in favor of a municipality's right to use automated enforcement technology in a fair and judicious manner.

Will people know when they are entering a School enforcement zone?

Yes. Signs will be posted at every enforced zone, warning drivers that photo enforcement is in use ahead.

Can I challenge my citation?

Yes. Each citation ticket contains detailed information on how to exercise your due process rights and contest the citation.

What about privacy? Will I be photographed in my vehicle?

No. Vehicles following traffic laws are not photographed. Additionally, the driver is not visible on the citation.

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers</u>* must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.

*PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PRICE OF YELLOW TRASH BAGS HAS INCREASED. <u>THEY ARE NOW \$40.50 FOR A ROLL OF 10</u>.




