MAYOR GARDNER'S REPORT

Good Afternoon Willoughby Hills!

I hope to see many of you tomorrow at our annual Touch-A-Truck event. The Fire Department, Recreation Commission, Police Department and Service Department have been working hard to make it a fun and informative event. We will start at 10:00 AM and continue until 2:00 PM. In addition to vehicles from the WHFD, WHPD and Service Department, we are expecting vehicles on display from the Lake County Sheriff's Department, the Ohio Highway Patrol, the Western Lake County SWAT Team and other area agencies as well as a medical helicopter from University Hospitals, which is expected to arrive at City Hall near the beginning of the event and depart around 11:30 AM (please note that their appearance is tentative based upon a number of factors, including if they receive a call for service). The Fire Department will also be demonstrating the tools and techniques used to extricate a victim trapped in a damaged vehicle following an accident. This demonstration is expected to start around 1:00 PM Parking will be available in the Community Center and Roemisch Fields parking lots. As a quick reminder, pickleball and tennis players who wish to enter or exit Campbell Park during those hours should park in the Eddy Road parking lot. Please do not attempt to drive through the event or use the Police Department emergency access driveway.

I received an email with exciting news from the Ohio Department of Transportation ("ODOT") this week regarding future improvements along Interstate 90 in the City. As some of you may recall, last fall Chief Gandee, Lieutenant DiMattia and I met with representatives from ODOT to discuss the installation of guard rails in the median along I-90 between Bishop Road and the Interstate 271 interchange. ODOT has approved this project and has now prepared plans for these guard rails. The plans are now under review by various agencies who regularly operate in that area, including the WHPD and WHFD. ODOT has advised that they hope to take the project to bid this winter with construction next year. I would like to thank ODOT District 12 Deputy Director John Picuri, Traffic Engineers Brian Blayney and James Albright and the rest of the ODOT team for making this important safety improvement possible for our City.

You may have noticed that signs went up near the entrances to the City regarding our photo enforcement program. These signs are another step in attempting to be transparent about this program. The City's intent is for our motorists to comply with the posted speed limits to make our roads safer for everyone. The Police Department has been coordinating the final steps for installation of the cameras and start-up of the program with hopes that it will kick-off in the next month. In addition to the warning signs at City entrances, when the cameras are activated there will be a 30 day period where only warnings are issued to remind motorists to comply with speed limits. Please remember that this is focused on our two school zones, on SOM Center Road in front of Cornerstone Christian Academy and Chardon Road in front of the School of Innovation, and the Interstate highways. For the school zones, citations will be issued if motorists exceed the posted limits by more than 10 miles per hour during school hours or when signs are flashing. On the interstates, citations will be issued to motorists exceeding 15 miles per hour over the posted speed limits.

Finally, today the City's new website [www.willoughbyhills-oh.gov] was activated. Special thanks to communication supervisor Karen Mehollin for all of her hard work on this project. Karen has been working toward this goal with the Department Directors and Chiefs and our Website Host for the last few of months to create the new site and transition information from the old website. The new website has been designed to be much more user-friendly for on-line visitors looking for information about our City.

Have a great weekend and I hope to see you tomorrow at Touch-A-Truck.

BRUSH PICK UP

The Service Department is wrapping up their storm brush pick up throughout the City.

The last day for this service will be <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 20th</u>. If you have any remaining brush to be picked up from the recent storms that took place, please bring it to the tree lawn before the September 20th deadline.

Only storm brush will be picked up.

DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE TRAINING

The Department of Defense, in conjunction with local and federal law enforcement, will be conducting training in and around the greater Cleveland area. Please be advised that there will be an increase in flight activity in and around the Cuyahoga County Airport from Sept 17 through the 23rd. This is a planned exercise in cooperation with local authorities and is not in response to any current world events. The exercise is expected to have minimal impact to the public.

To maintain the highest level of safety, there are no public viewing or media opportunities planned during this event.

SNOW PLOW REGISTRATION

June 1st began the new year for snow plow registration. Registration IS required if you plan to remove snow from private driveways or private parking areas in the City during the 2023-2024 winter season. Cost to register is \$25.00 for the first vehicle and \$5.00 for each additional vehicle. Registration is required annually (expiring May 31, 2024) and there is no prorating of registration fees. Press Release

WILLOUGHBY HILLS (Friday, August 25, 2023) - The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is proposing to resurface US-6 (Chardon Rd) between SR-91 (Som Center Rd) and SR-84 (Bishop Rd).

This project is a follow-up to the 2022 project which involved resurfacing Chardon Rd. east of Som Center Rd. Construction is tentatively scheduled to be completed between March and October of 2024. Detailed project schedule information will be refined in Spring 2024.

During construction, Chardon Rd is expected to be open to westbound traffic only. Eastbound traffic will be detoured through Eddy Rd. via Bishop Rd., Rockefeller Rd., and Som Center Rd. To reduce the impact on traffic, the project is being planned for construction in two phases. During the first phase, the portion of Chardon Rd. between Bishop Rd. and Rockefeller Rd. will be resurfaced. During the second phase, the portion of Chardon Rd. between Rockefeller Rd. and Som Center Rd. will be resurfaced.

The estimated construction cost is \$1.4 million.



Rogers Road Closure UPDATE:

Rogers Road continues to be closed to traffic (both lanes) in order to facilitate construction of a retaining wall project alongside the Chagrin River. The nearest address to the closure location is 37000 Rogers Road. Traffic will be detoured through River Road, Chardon Road, and Worrell Road. All private drive entrances will remain open. Schirmer Construction will be performing the work. Please plan accordingly.

Traffic Safety Enforcement Program

Each year, too many families are affected by crashes caused by speeding. Sadly, the victims of traffic crashes are often occupants of other vehicles who have fallen victim to speeding and careless driving.

Improving traffic safety for residents and visitors is a strategic goal of the Willoughby Hills Police Department. That is why I am so pleased to report that we are implementing a photo enforcement system in Willoughby Hills. The state of the art system is designed to help us encourage safer driving habits and save lives.

Our police officers cannot enforce traffic laws everywhere, all the time. The new enforcement system will allow us to enforce traffic laws in a safer way for the officer and the violator. There are no upfront costs to the taxpayers and, over time, violators will fund this program.

I encourage you to respect the rules of the road – help keep yourself and your neighbors safe and sound. Join me in supporting our new traffic enforcement system.

Question & Answer



There will be a warning period for the first 30 days, after the program begins.

Is speeding a public safety concern?

According to the IIHS, speeding is a factor in one-third of all fatal crashes in the U.S., killing more than 10,000 people per year. In addition, according to the NHTSA, speed-related crashes cost the U.S. economy approximately \$40 billion per year.

How will the new Speed Enforcement Program work to protect lives in Willoughby Hills?

This Traffic Enforcement Program will protect lives by reminding motorists to slowdown and obey speed laws. Automated safety cameras will identify motorists who are breaking the law by exceeding the speed limits. The registered owner of the violating vehicle will receive a traffic citation in the mail.

What systems will the police department be using?

The Willoughby Hills Police Department will be utilizing handheld and fixed location photo enforcement equipment. In school zones, we have set up fixed location cameras to capture vehicles traveling at an unsafe speed in an effort to keep our children safer. These will be operational only on school days during school hours. The handheld equipment will be used by certified police officers in multiple locations along the interstate and other roadways in the community. The system will be used to identify and ticket speeding vehicles in a manner that is potentially safer for the officer and occupants of the vehicle.

Does someone double-check the evidence?

Sworn police officers will determine violations. Our vendor will do the initial screenings of information for photo and data quality. Officers will review every violation to verify vehicle information and ensure the vehicle is in violation. These officers will utilize the same standards for photo enforcement as they would with a standard violation event. Upon officer approval, a citation will be mailed to the vehicle owner. The owner will then have the right to pay the citation or exercise a contest process.

What are the Traffic Enforcement fines in the City of Willoughby Hills?

Speed Over	Fine Amount Owed	Fine if in a Construction or School Zone
1-19 MPH	\$150.00	\$150.00
20-29 MPH	\$200.00	\$200.00
30+ MPH	\$300.00	\$300.00

Are automated enforcement cameras legal?

Yes. Courts have ruled in favor of a municipality's right to use automated enforcement technology in a fair and judicious manner.

Will people know when they are entering a School enforcement zone?

Yes. Signs will be posted at every enforced zone, warning drivers that photo enforcement is in use ahead.

Can I challenge my citation?

Yes. Each citation ticket contains detailed information on how to exercise your due process rights and contest the citation.

What about privacy? Will I be photographed in my vehicle?

No. Vehicles following traffic laws are not photographed. Additionally, the driver is not visible on the citation.

YARD WASTE SERVICE BEGINS ON APRIL 1, 2023 AND GOES UNTIL NOVEMBER 30, 2023

YOU WILL BE SERVICED WEEKLY ON YOUR TRASH DAY

- <u>Yellow Bag Service Customers*</u> must contact Republic Services to set up Yard Waste Services. Please call 800-968-7789 to set up. (*See note below regarding yellow bag price increase.)
- Leaf pick up will be handled by the City in the Fall.

DO NOT MIX YARD WASTE AND TRASH

SEE REQUIREMENTS BELOW FOR YARD WASTE SERVICES

- Please make sure that yard waste is in Brown Kraft Biodegradable Paper Bags or in your own 32 gallon container clearly marked "Yard Waste."
 - Please also make sure that the biodegradable bags/cans do not exceed 40 lbs.

Any tree branches must be tied and bundled no longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 4 inches in diameter and cannot exceed 30 lbs.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

• Dirt, large rocks and tree stumps, construction debris and landscape timbers are not acceptable items and will not be removed by Republic.
