OTHER ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS (Audio 27:25)

- **Council President Kline:** For a while, I have been thinking about some changes that Council could make in regard to some of our practices and policies. I think these can help expedite and improve our work. I decided that if I was re-elected president, I wanted to put these changes forward to see if we have agreement on making these changes. This first one is adopting “consent agenda.” For those who are unfamiliar with this, a “consent agenda” is a means to shorten meetings. A consent agenda does not replace a normal meeting agenda. It is a single item on the overall agenda.
- The consent agenda uses a single motion to approve multiple non-controversial items (ordinances, resolutions, motions). Elements held in the consent agenda are not subject to further debate or discussion when a vote is taken.
- Any councilmember can request a consent agenda item be removed and returned to the normal agenda.
- Consent agendas may not include items that may generate a high degree of public interest, involve large financial implications, or require detailed discussions. Such items would remain on the normal meeting agenda.
- Items on the consent agenda must be on third reading. The consent agenda vote is only adopting or approving.
- The Council President and the Council Clerk determine which items should be in the consent agenda.

- Before the use of a consent agenda is permitted, an ordinance must be adopted to allow the use of it. Once approved, using a consent agenda is not mandatory. It is possible we will never use it.

It does give us the opportunity to save some time if there are a number of items on the agenda that qualify.

- **Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz:** Just to be clear, if there were several items we wanted to pass on the consent agenda, they would have to be read at two previous meetings and then passed at the third meeting, correct?
- **Council President Kline:** Correct.
- **Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz:** So, we would still have three meetings?
- **Council President Kline:** Yes. A good example of this would be our December Council meeting where we had a large amount of legislation that were on first reading. All that could not have gone on a consent agenda. But, if we get motions for supplies such as salt, limestone, and asphalt, while simultaneously having ordinances on third reading, all those items can be combined on a consent agenda. This would require one vote to approve or disapprove them.
- We don't have to take a formal vote on this, but if everyone is in favor of this, at the next Council meetings, we will have an ordinance on this which gives everyone another opportunity to ask questions regarding this. It can be a tool to save some time.
- **Council Vice President Taylor Draper:** This is used in Solon, correct? If we wanted to see how this is used, we can look at Solon's meetings. Is that correct?
- **Council President Kline:** Yes, they use it a lot. They always have a fair number of ordinances and resolutions. It is a very simple process.
- **Council President Kline:** For the last six years, we have held the Working Committee of Council and Rules & Legislation meeting on Mondays at 6:00 p.m. Agendas, ordinances, resolutions, and supporting documents sometimes do not go out to Council until very late on Friday or even on Monday. This has created a dilemma for us. Many times, this necessitates Council members spending a great deal of time over the weekend preparing for Monday's meeting. Council, at times, may even come into meetings feeling that they're not fully ready to discuss items on the agenda. As a result of this, I would like us to consider moving the Working Committee of Council and Rules & Legislation to Thursday, preceding each Council meeting. There are quite a few cities that follow this procedure. They may not call it "Working Committee" but it meets the same purpose. On Council weeks, we would have two meetings on the same evening back to back. I would like to open this to discussion.
- **Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz:** I agree with this. A lot of times, our Monday meetings are very quick and we get only some of the necessary information. We can use Thursdays to discuss and have an explanation of each ordinance and then vote on them at the following meeting.
- **Council Vice President Taylor Draper:** What would be the start time of this meeting? Would it be an hour like we have now, or thirty minutes?
- **Council President Kline:** We are locked into Council meetings starting at 7:00 p.m. per the Charter. This cannot change. We have flexibility on when to start the Working Committees. I

went back and looked at how long the Working Committees were throughout 2025. The average time was thirty-one minutes. This takes into consideration the longer meetings where we had speakers come in or major discussion points. My thinking is, we could start the Committee-of-the-whole at 6:30 p.m. This should go right up to the 7:00 p.m. Council Meeting. If we knew in advance that there was going to be a large number of ordinances and resolutions on the agenda, or there was going to be a major discussion item, we could always move the Working Committee to 6:15 p.m. or 6:00 p.m. if we had to. On average, I think we could start the Committee-of-the-whole at 6:30.

- **Councilwoman Miller:** What did you say is the average time again?
- **Council President Kline:** Thirty-one minutes.
- **Councilwoman Miller:** There were a few meetings that made that bump up. Is 6:30 p.m. soon enough?
- **Council President Kline:** Yes. We had a few meetings that went fifteen to twenty minutes. Some went just under thirty minutes. There were a few rare ones that went to forty-five minutes.
- **Council Vice President Taylor Draper:** I seem to be in favor of that. I think because we receive a lot of the agenda items on Friday, having extra time to review and even get with some of the department heads to ask questions is an advantage for us. It will give us more time to read, understand, go over, and ask questions regarding legislation. I think that is a good thing.
- **Council President Kline:** Along the same lines to help this even more, I thought we should establish a hard cut-off of 12:00 p.m. on Friday for final resolutions and ordinances to be in the Council Clerk's hands. Anything coming after that time, unless it is an emergency or something that would need to be put on the agenda where there would be a significant financial cost to the City, would be cut off at noon. The Council Clerk would then spend early Friday afternoon getting everything together and out to Council. Then, we wouldn't have to worry about items coming in on Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday. I would like to open this discussion up to Council.
- In conjunction with that, I think what might be a benefit to everyone is that as we do our reviews of the information for the Working Session, I would like to see questions and comments passed to the Council Clerk as you are doing your review. The Council Clerk will then disperse these questions out to the appropriate party (Department heads, Law Director, Finance Director) with request for immediate response. When it comes back to the Council Clerk, the response will be sent out to everyone. When we have Working Committees, these questions and comments will be presented so the public knows what came up. I think this will give us all more information ahead of time and will result in less time spent at the Working Committee.
- **Council Vice President Taylor Draper:** I agree.
- **Council President Kline:** The one last thing on this would be a checklist to aid Council when they get their packets. Other cities use a similar format. This is a work in progress but I would like to see the Council Clerk fill out a checklist when the information comes in. The checklist would contain information such as if the ordinance needs to be passed on first reading, and if so, why, what is the impact of this ordinance, does it impact the budget, is the purchase above or

below the budgeted amount, etc. You may find there are other questions and comments that would benefit. If it is not clear when he gets the information, do contact the appropriate party to seek out that information. For each ordinance, there will be a checklist so we can see what we have. Speaking for myself, and I think others feel the same way, when we go into Council meetings, it is nice to know ahead of time what the administration wants passed on first reading so we are not being caught off guard.

- With that being said, if the consensus is to go forward, at our first Council meeting, there will be no Working Committee on Monday. It will be on Thursday at 6:30 p.m. followed by the Regular Council Meeting. We will go from there.
- **Councilwoman Miller:** I have one question/suggestion. Since we are not going to be meeting on the dais until Thursday, we are still going to want working copies of the legislation in front of us. Can they be put in our boxes ahead of time and not have a new fresh set to cut down on use of paper?
- **Council President Kline:** Absolutely. We will ask the Council Clerk, when he puts packets together, to put them in the mailboxes.
- **Council Clerk Nicholas Aiello:** I would be happy to do that for you.
- **Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz:** Another item I would like to discuss would be when we have items we discuss with the Law Director or Administration; I think it would be advantageous to have an update in each meeting rather than hear no report and not talk about it for months. When we do question, the response is “We are working on it” but it would be good to know why they are still working on said item or what the holdup would be that way we don’t forget something and we don’t overlook something.
- **Council President Kline:** I don’t see why that can’t be done.
- **Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz:** That way, we would be kept in the loop as well. There have been times when we just hear about something suddenly that just pops up. I could think of a couple different things that we have discussed and wanted to do something about but didn’t know what was going on with it other than that it is being looked at or it is being worked on. But it would be good to know why it wasn’t getting done or what the holdup is through a brief discussion.
- **Council Vice President Taylor Draper:** I like that. I think because we are not here every day, we don’t know the reasons that we are getting legislation at times. I know sometimes we get memos that explain it, but it would also be helpful to hear some of the details about what is going on and would help us understand why we are voting on things. I think that is a good idea.
