PUBLIC PORTION #1 (Audio: 4:28 – 7:32)

An opportunity for the public to address Council concerning anything pertaining to tonight’s agenda.

Council Vice President Kline stated on behalf of **Council President Hallum** that since he could not be in attendance tonight he has asked Council not to vote on Ordinance 2022-037 because of the work that he has done on this Ordinance. He would like to participate when this is up for vote and will therefore remain on Third Reading.

Public Portion #1 opened at 7:05pm.

Jenna Bing, 36951 Beech Hills Drive, Willoughby Hills, OH 44094, stated that it’s ridiculous that one person not being at tonight’s meeting is holding up the voting process for Ordinance 2022-037. Also, she stated that she doesn’t understand why a council person who was found not guilty was not indemnified. “Why not just pay the bill?” She stated that the longer this Ordinance sits is longer that the bill is not being paid.

Mark Belich, 37200 Chardon Road, Willoughby Hills, OH 44094, stated that he is also disappointed that Council will not be voting on Ordinance 2022-037. “This is not a moral or ethical issue – it’s an issue of the law.” He went on to say that every council member has sworn on oath to uphold the charter of the law. Ms. Fellows knew the law and knew there was notice required. This Ordinance should be voted on tonight and Council should vote no.

MAYOR’S REPORT (Audio: 7:38 – 11:44)

Mayor Gardner stated the following:

- The City is near completion of the resurfacing of Chardon Road. Striping and painting is near completion and the traffic signal work has been completed. Many thanks to the residents for their cooperation and patience during the project.
- Fire hydrant painting is proceeding. Considerable progress has been made on the hydrants on the east side that were most in need. There are still a couple dozen remaining but waiting on supplies from the County.
- Engine 1214 has returned after being sent out to address corrosion issues and have its annual preventative maintenance completed. The City hopes that it will be able to serve the community on the front line until the new engine is here next summer. It will then be able to serve as a reserve engine for another ten years. Thank you to Wickliffe’s Mayor Sakacs and Chief Powers for loaning the City one of their engines for the last few months while this work was being done.
- Block Party Program: Contact the Mayor’s Office if you would like to participate this summer.
- Trivia Night is next Tuesday at 7:00pm in the O’Ryan Room at the Community Center. There’s been an average of six teams participating since it began and we’d like to keep it growing.
- Safety Town begins next week. Looking forward to starting up the program again. Thank you to Judge Crane for keeping the program going.
- Rock n Roll Day: This is an all-day event so if anyone is interested in helping, volunteer sign-up is available through the Mayor’s Office.
- The Service Director’s truck has come in, is almost complete, and should be on the road next week.
- Thank you to all of the Council Members, Firefighter Hoffman and fellow firefighters for their help with the beautification of City Hall and the planters around the Fire Department. Also, thank you to Gloria Majeski for taking care of the planters behind City Hall in front of the Police Department. Their time and effort put in to making the City look nice is greatly appreciated.
- Please keep the Erich family in your thoughts and prayers as Ron Erich, longtime resident and former Fire Department member, recently passed away.

- Lastly, the Noise Abatement Meeting was this morning and Gary Pratt had the following to report:
 - April 1 to June 30, 2022 – 7,382 operations; 89 operations during Voluntary Noise Abatement (VNA) hours of 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. with nine complaints. None of which were Willoughby Hills residents.
 - For comparison (during the second quarter of 2021): 7,368 operations; 78 operations during VNA hours with three complaints. None of which were from Willoughby Hills.

LAW DIRECTOR'S REPORT (Audio: 11:48 – 17:42)

Law Director Lucas reported an update regarding INSA Ordinance 2022-034. He stated that Troy Judy, the representative for the dispensary, has been trying to reschedule a previously canceled meeting. It's been noted by Franz Ward's attorney at their meeting presentation that provisions need to be made to the Ordinance because of State of Ohio regulations. **Law Director Lucas** stated that a meeting with the attorney would be appropriate and hopes to have something planned soon to discuss concerns, provisions, and monetary amounts listed in the Ordinance.

Questions/comments following Law Director's Report:

Councilwoman Taylor Draper asked if the City is able to charge a permit fee every year or not. **Law Director Lucas** stated that he believes the City is able to under the local Charter. In addition, fees charged at the State level preempt fees at the City level.

Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz stated that he thought the City was allowed to charge a fee, but there was a set limit. **Law Director Lucas** responded that anything where the City was charging fees might be subject to the State taking the field exclusively and eliminating that charging ability as part of the Municipality.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (Audio: 17:44 – 25:15)

Finance Director Brichacek stated that the first six months of the year have been completed and the reports are set to post to the website next week. In terms of revenue, all general revenue sources are on target except court fees seem to be lagging a bit. Income Tax, after six months, is approximately \$600,000 ahead of the June 30, 2021 total which is more than what was budgeted. **Finance Director Brichacek** continued to say that the second payment of \$500,000 from the American Rescue Plan is due to arrive soon. Also, the cooperative salt bid has been received by ODOT and came in at \$44.13/ton which was approximately what was budgeted this year. Lastly, the State Treasurer's Office has all of the City's information into May but have only posted up to March on their website.

Questions/comments following Finance Director's Report:

Council Vice President Kline asked Finance Director Brichacek if he understood correctly that the American Rescue Plan money coming in is the money that was expected for the second payment and nothing additional.

Finance Director Brichacek stated that Council Vice President Kline is correct. As of now, the only obligation for the funds is the Parking Lot but the City has until 2026 to fully expend funds.

Councilwoman Belich commented for understanding that the County will also receive American Rescue Plan Funds and they would be able to allocate to smaller communities in the County to which they see fit? Is there a possibility to receive additional funds from the County should that be the case?

Finance Director Brichacek stated that he had not been advised that the City would be receiving any additional money from the County. Whether it's possible to receive additional County funds is up to the Commissioners.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT (Audio: 25:17 – 26:50)

City Engineer DiFranco stated that he fully supports Ordinances 2022-039, 2022-040, and 2022-041 for construction projects. Ordinance 2022-039 is to award the Salt Storage Facility project to Greystone Construction for \$246,130.50 as obtained through the Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing Program. Ordinance 2022-040 is to award the City Hall Parking Lot Resurfacing project to Ohio Paving and Construction for \$94,254.30 as obtained through competitive bidding. Ordinance 2022-041 is to award the Entrance Drive Replacement project to T.C. Construction for \$143,150.40 as obtained also be competitive bidding. **City Engineer DiFranco** requested that Council waive the Three Reading Rule and adopt these Ordinances tonight due to uncertain economic conditions, supply chain issues, and labor shortages. Several schedules are being juggled in hopes of completing these projects this year.

Recreation Commission Report by Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz (Audio: 26:58 – 30:54)

Councilman Jarmuszkiewicz reported the following:

- Safety Town begins next week.
- Rock and Roll Day will be August 13th. It will be an all day event from 10:00am to 10:00pm and volunteers are still needed and can be done online through Sign-Up Genius. Pickleball is doing well and tends to have people from all over the area on the courts on any given day.
- Recreation is hoping to get equipment rental going as well as time and date set up for instruction.

Councilwoman Taylor Draper added that there will be bands, kid events, food trucks, tribute to Michael Stanley, a car show, cornhole tournament, and much more. Please get the word out. **Council Vice President** also added that there have been vendor booth requests, including a renowned photographer who has taken many celebrity photos.

PC-ABR – reported by Councilwoman Taylor Draper (Audio: 30:57 – 32:50)

Councilwoman Taylor Draper reported that the committee met July 7, 2022. ABR had one project to review, but due to lack of quorum, the meeting had to be postponed. It has been rescheduled for July 21, 2022.

The Master Plan group will reconvene next Wednesday, July 20, 2022, with Mr. Radachy with hopes of finalizing plans for the Master Plan.

Councilwoman Taylor Draper also gave a Zoning Inspector report: Mr. Hopkins has cited two homes that have unkept lawns and fallen trees. He's issued citations to unlicensed vehicles and various other matters. **Councilwoman Taylor Draper** reminded residents that Mr. Hopkins is in place to ensure the City maintains its' beauty and properties are up to City Codes. Most have complied but when a resident does not, they are subject to Mayor's Court and fines.

Beautification Committee – reported by Councilwoman Taylor Draper: 32:52 – 33:45)

Councilwoman Taylor Draper began thanking Firefighter Nate Hoffmann for maintaining the flowers around the fire house. Volunteers are still needed to help keep the flowers at City Hall watered and looking beautiful. **Council Vice President Kline** thanked Road Superintendent Grubiss and his staff for installing soaker hoses and sprinklers along the City Hall landscape which reduced manual work and is very much appreciated.
