CITY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES Winfield, Kansas June 15, 2020

The Board of City Commissioners met in regular session, Monday, June 15, 2020 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Commission-Community Council Meeting Room, City Hall; Mayor Phillip R. Jarvis presiding. Commissioners Ronald E. Hutto and Gregory N. Thompson were also present. Also in attendance were Taggart Wall, City Manager; Brenda Peters, City Clerk and William E. Muret, City Attorney. Other staff members present were Gary Mangus, Assistant to the City Manager; and Patrick Steward, Director of Public Improvements.

Mayor Jarvis noted all members present.

Commissioner Thompson moved that the minutes of the June 1, 2020 meeting be approved. Commissioner Hutto seconded the motion. With all Commissioners voting aye, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Bill No. 2034 – **An Ordinance** – Adopting an Ordinance regulating the sale of alcoholic liquor within the City of Winfield, Kansas, by repealing Section 6-194 and adopting a new Section 6-194, Article III, Chapter 6 of the Code of the City of Winfield, Kansas. City Manager Wall explained to the Commission that this Ordinance would allow the sale of liquor on Sundays and certain holidays that are not currently allowed. This would not require businesses to sell on Sundays but would make it allowable. Upon motion by Commissioner Hutto, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, all Commissioners voting aye, Bill No. 2034 was adopted and numbered Ordinance No. 4127.

Bill No. 2035 – **A Resolution** – Authorizing and directing the Mayor of the City of Winfield, Kansas, to execute a Request to Exchange Federal Funds, between the City and the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Transportation, relating to making state funds available to the City in exchange for the City's allotment of federal funds. Director of Public Improvements Steward explained to the Commission that this Resolution considers applying for the exchange of federal fund dollars through the State of Kansas. The City has federal funds of \$257,053.73 which would be roughly \$231,000.00 available for street projects. Funds are exchanged at a rate of 90/10. Upon motion by Commissioner Thompson, seconded by Commissioner Hutto, all Commissioners voting aye, Bill No. 2035 was adopted and numbered Resolution No. 3020.

Bill No. 2036 – A Resolution – Authorizing and directing the Mayor and Clerk of the City of Winfield, Kansas, to execute a contract for Project No. 18-TD869 for Stonebrook Phase 1 Street Improvements between the City of Winfield, Kansas and APAC-Kansas, Inc., Shears Division. Director of Public Improvements Steward explained to the Commission that this Resolution considers awarding a contract to APAC-Kansas, Inc., Shears Division in the amount of \$143,615.75. Upon motion by Commissioner Hutto, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, all Commissioners voting aye, Bill No. 2036 was adopted and numbered Resolution No. 3120.

OTHER BUSINESS

-Consider a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Winfield and Cowley County regarding activation of outdoor warning sirens. Assistant to the City Manager Mangus explained to the Commission that this Memorandum would formalize a relationship between the City and Cowley County Emergency Management that has existed for decades. The City will continue to own the sirens and poles, the County will have authority to activate the sirens. Upon motion by Commissioner Thompson, seconded by Commissioner Hutto all Commissioners voting aye, the Memorandum of Understanding was approved.

-Authorizing the City Manager to negotiate a contract with APAC-Kansas, Inc., Shears Division, for work on 13th and 14th Avenues and South Pike Rd for street overlay projects. Commissioner Hutto made a motion to authorize the City Manager to negotiate a contract with APAC-Kansas, Inc., Shears Division, not to exceed \$75,000. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Thompson. With all Commissioners voting aye, motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT

Upon motion by Mayor Hutto, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, all Commissioners voting aye, the meeting adjourned at 5:40 p.m.



Action Requested: 7/6/2020 Commission Agenda-consideration of a Resolution authorizing an Outdoor Community. Event & Temporary Entertainment District Application (YP of Cowley County)

Analysis: Young Professionals of Cowley County (YP), through an Outdoor Community Event & Temporary Entertainment District application, have requested authorization to allow the sale, possession, and consumption of alcohol on city streets and public sidewalks. Their request is to establish a "Beer Garden" from 4:30 pm to 8:30 pm on the north half of Millington Street between 9th and 10th Avenues, July 17, 2020, in conjunction with the Summer Music Crawl.

YP has contracted with Bottle Service LLC, a local Caterer licensed by the KS Alcohol Beverage Control Division and City of Winfield. With adoption of this Resolution, identifying the Fall Music Crawl as a special event, Bottle Service will notify the ABC by electronic notification of its intent to sell and serve alcoholic liquor by individual drink at least 48 hours prior to the event. A separate Temporary Alcohol Permit is not required by YP, Winfield Chamber of Commerce, or Bottle Service LLC.

YP has successfully used this process to offer a "Beer Garden" for several Spring & Fall Music Crawls. No incidents have come from any of the previous requests.

Fiscal Impact: YP has requested from the City additional trash containers.

The City of Winfield defines an Outdoor Community Event as follows:

• Outdoor event on public property organized for a particular and limited purpose and time. Such events shall include, but not be limited to fun runs, roadway foot races, fundraising walks, bikeathons, motor vehicle events, bike races, carnivals, festivals, cookouts, block parties, community celebrations, shows, exhibitions, circuses, fairs and temporary entertainment districts. Such term shall also include parades when held in conjunction with a community event as defined by this section, which event is sponsored or conducted by the same applicant. Such term shall not include events occurring solely on sidewalks or public rights of way immediately adjacent to public streets that do not require the closing of the sidewalk or public way.

The City of Winfield defines a Temporary Entertainment District as follows:

A defined area, which includes City streets, alleys, parking lots and public sidewalks on which
the City Commission has authorized the sale, possession or consumption of alcoholic liquor or cereal
malt beverage for a specified period of time, during a Community Event which has been properly
permitted.

General Information:

It is the purpose of this application to establish a process for permitting community events to use City streets, sidewalks, parks and alleys. It is unlawful for any person to conduct a community event without a community event permit. Any information required by the application must be complete upon submittal. Incomplete applications may be denied. The City of Winfield may refuse any application received less than 30 days before the event or lacking requested information. When received, an application is subject to approval of all departments involved and will be required to provide the following:

- The Winfield Police Department, the Winfield Fire Department and authorized representatives of such departments shall be responsible for the enforcement of all provisions of this application.
- No fee shall be charged for the application or permit for a Community Event itself.
- The issuance of a Community Event permit shall not negate the responsibility of the permit holder to acquire all other necessary and applicable licenses or permits which may be required for the event or pay any additional fees.
- Street closure request made to the City of Winfield.
- Certificate of General Liability Insurance naming the City of Winfield as additionally insured, if applicable.
- Security requirements including hiring of certified law enforcement officers.
- All Food/Beverage/Concessionaire/Amusement vendors list including contact person, contact information, and permits/licenses, as necessary.
- Outdoor Community Events shall cease between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday and midnight to 8:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday.
- A detailed Security Plan will be required and approved by Winfield Chief of Police. Extraordinary Police/Fire services will be billed directly to the permit holder and will be the permit holder's responsibility.











Site Map for 2020 Summer YP Cowley **Beer and Wine Garden**

an Outdoor Community Event and Temporary Entertainment District Application (Young Professionals of Cowley County)

WHEREAS, Young Professionals of Cowley County has made application for an Outdoor Community Event and Temporary Entertainment District; and

WHEREAS, Young Professionals of Cowley County requests the sale, possession, and consumption of alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage on city streets, alleys, parking lots, and public sidewalks during the Summer Music Crawl, a special event, from 4:30 pm to 8:30 pm, on July 17, 2020, on the north half of Millington Street between 9th and 10th Avenues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WINFIELD, KANSAS, THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> Within Section 6-120 of Article IV of Section 6 of the Code of the City of Winfield, Kansas, "Temporary Entertainment District" means a defined area, which includes City streets, alleys, parking lots and public sidewalks on which the City Commission has authorized the sale, possession or consumption of alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage for a specified period of time, during a community event which has been properly permitted under Chapter 8 of this Code.

Section 2. A Special Event is defined by K.S.A. 41.719(a)(2). Alcoholic liquor may be consumed at a special event held on public streets, alleys, roads, sidewalks, or highways when a temporary permit has been issued pursuant to K.S.A. 41-2645 for such special event. Such special event must be approved, by ordinance or resolution, by the local governing body of any city, county, or township where such special event is being held. No alcoholic liquor may be consumed inside vehicles while on public streets, alleys, roads, or highways at any such special event.

Section 3. Young Professionals of Cowley County has contracted with Bottle Service LLC, 1421 Millington Street, Winfield KS, a Caterer licensed by the Kansas Department of Revenue, Alcoholic Beverage Control Division, and the City of Winfield. A "caterer" means an individual, partnership or corporation which sells alcoholic liquor by the individual drink, and provides services related thereto, on unlicensed premises which may be open to the public, but does not include a holder of a temporary permit. [Subsection (c) of K.S.A. 41-2601]. Kansas Department of Revenue, Alcoholic Beverage Control Division granted Bottle Service LLC liquor

license #4760, attached and made a part hereof, effective 02/21/2020 and expiring 02/20/2022. Bottle Service LLC will notify the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division Director by electronic notification of its intent to sell and serve alcoholic liquor by individual drink at least 48 hours prior to the event. A separate Temporary Alcohol Permit is not required of Young Professionals of Cowley County or Bottle Service LLC.

Section 4. The governing body of the city of Winfield Kansas hereby authorizes Outdoor Community Event and Temporary Entertainment District Application in accordance with the rules and procedures set forth by Article IV of Section 6 of the Code of the City of Winfield, Kansas, regarding the sale, possession or consumption of alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage as presented by the Young Professionals of Cowley County for the Summer Music Crawl, a special event, from 4:30 pm to 8:30 pm, on July 17, 2020, on the north half of Millington Street between 9th and 10th Avenues, Winfield Kansas as identified in the Outdoor Community Event and Temporary Entertainment District Application; a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

<u>Section 5.</u> This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

There will be no sales of alcohol or beer as part of the event. All is provided via sponsor. With adoption of this Resolution, identifying the Kansas Air National Guard Lyle Houghton Cancer Benefit Golf Tournament as a special event, the Governing Body would authorize the request for possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage as a Temporary Entertainment District. A Temporary Alcohol or Cereal Malt Beverage Permit is not required of Jayhawk Advisory Council for possession and consumption only.

• Outdoor event on public property organized for a particular and limited purpose and time. Such events shall include, but not be limited to fun runs, roadway foot races, fundraising walks, bikeathons, motor vehicle events, bike races, carnivals, festivals, cookouts, block parties, community celebrations, shows, exhibitions, circuses, fairs and temporary entertainment districts. Such term shall also include parades when held in conjunction with a community event as defined by this section, which event is sponsored or conducted by the same applicant. Such term shall not include events occurring solely on sidewalks or public rights of way immediately adjacent to public streets that do not require the closing of the sidewalk or public way.

The City of Winfield defines a Temporary Entertainment District as follows:

A defined area, which includes City streets, alleys, parking lots and public sidewalks on which
the City Commission has authorized the sale, possession or consumption of alcoholic liquor or cereal
malt beverage for a specified period of time, during a Community Event which has been properly
permitted.

General Information:

It is the purpose of this application to establish a process for permitting community events to use City streets, sidewalks, parks and alleys. It is unlawful for any person to conduct a community event without a community event permit. Any information required by the application must be complete upon submittal. Incomplete applications may be denied. The City of Winfield may refuse any application received less than 30 days before the event or lacking requested information. When received, an application is subject to approval of all departments involved and will be required to provide the following:

- The Winfield Police Department, the Winfield Fire Department and authorized representatives of such departments shall be responsible for the enforcement of all provisions of this application.
- No fee shall be charged for the application or permit for a Community Event itself.
- The issuance of a Community Event permit shall not negate the responsibility of the permit holder to acquire all other necessary and applicable licenses or permits which may be required for the event or pay any additional fees.
- Street closure request made to the City of Winfield.
- Certificate of General Liability Insurance naming the City of Winfield as additionally insured, if applicable.
- Security requirements including hiring of certified law enforcement officers.
- All Food/Beverage/Concessionaire/Amusement vendors list including contact person, contact information, and permits/licenses, as necessary.
- Outdoor Community Events shall cease between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday and midnight to 8:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday.
- A detailed Security Plan will be required and approved by Winfield Chief of Police. Extraordinary Police/Fire services will be billed directly to the permit holder and will be the permit holder's responsibility.

AN ORDINANCE

ESTABLISHING the requiring the wearing of masks or other face coverings in the corporate limits of the City of Winfield, Cowley County, Kansas.

WHEREAS, securing the public health and safety of residents of the City of Winfield is priority; and

WHEREAS, the United States Departments of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 beginning January 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization declared a pandemic on March 11, 2020; and

WHEREAS, a State of Disaster Emergency was proclaimed for the State of Kansas on March 12, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant an emergency declaration for all states, tribes, territories, and the District of Columbia pursuant to Section 50 1 (b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. § 5121-5207 (the "Stafford Act"); and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States pursuant to Sections 201 and 301 of the National Emergencies Act, 50 U.S.C. § 1601, et seq. and consistent with Section 1135 of the Social Security Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. § 1320b-5), declared a national emergency that the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States constitutes a national emergency beginning March 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, to provide for and ensure the health, safety, security, and welfare of the people of the City of Winfield, requiring that masks or other face coverings be worn in public spaces is necessary to promote and secure the safety and protection of the civilian population.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WINFIELD, KANSAS, THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 58 – Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article I- In General, is hereby amended to add and establish a new Section 58-6- Requiring of Wearing Masks in Public Places Within the City to read as follows:

(a) Definitions:

- a. "Mask or other face covering" means a covering of the nose and mouth that is secured to the head with ties, straps, loops over the ears or by some other means or is simply wrapped around the lower face. A mask or other face covering can be made of a variety of synthetic and natural fabrics, including cotton, silk, or linen. Ideally, a mask or other face covering has two or more layers. A mask or other face covering may be factory-made, sewn by hand, or can be improvised from household items such as scarfs, bandanas, t-shirts, sweatshirts, or towels.
- b. "Public space" means any indoor or outdoor space or area that is open to the public; this does not include private residential property or private offices or workspaces that are not open to customers or public visitors.

(b) Persons.

- a. All persons in the City of Winfield shall cover their mouths and noses with a mask or other face covering when they are in the following situations:
 - i. Inside any indoor public space where distancing of 6 feet at all times is not possible;
 - ii. In line and waiting to enter an indoor public space.

- iii. Obtaining services from the healthcare sector in settings, including but not limited to, a pharmacy, medical clinic, laboratory, physician or dental office, veterinary clinic, or blood bank, unless directed otherwise by an employee or healthcare provider.
- iv. Waiting for or riding on public transportation or while in a taxi, private car service, or ridesharing vehicle;
- v. While outdoors in public spaces and unable to maintain a 6-foot distance between individuals (not including individuals who reside together) with only infrequent or incidental moments of closer proximity.

(c) Businesses and Organizations.

- a. All businesses, organizations and non-profit associations in the City of Winfield must require all employees, customers, visitors, members, or members of the public to wear a mask or other face covering when:
 - i. Employees are working in any space visited by customers or members of the public, regardless of whether anyone from the public is present at the time;
 - ii. Employees are working in any space where food is prepared or packaged for sale or distribution to others;
 - iii. Customers, members, visitors, or members of the public are in a facility managed by the business or organization; or
 - iv. Employees are in any room or enclosed area where other people (except for individuals who reside together) are present and are unable to maintain a 6-foot distance except for infrequent or incidental moments of closer proximity.

(d) Exemptions.

- a. The following individuals are exempt from wearing masks or other face coverings in the situations described in Paragraphs (b) and (c):
 - Persons age five years or under; children age two years and under in particular should not wear a face covering because of the risk of suffocation;
 - ii. Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a face covering—this includes persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a face covering could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance;
 - iii. Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication:
 - iv. Persons for whom wearing a face covering would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidelines;
 - v. Persons who are obtaining a service involving the nose or face for which temporary removal of the face covering is necessary to perform the service:
 - vi. Persons who are seated at a restaurant or other establishment that offers food or beverage service, while they are eating or drinking, provided they maintain a 6-foot distance between individuals (not including individuals who reside together or are seated together) with only infrequent or incidental moments of closer proximity;
 - vii. Athletes who are engaged in an organized sports activity that allows athletes to maintain a 6-foot distance from others with only infrequent or incidental moments of closer proximity;
 - viii. Persons who are engaged in an activity that a professional or recreational association, regulatory entity, medical association, or other public-health-oriented entity has determined cannot be safely conducted while wearing a mask or other face covering;
 - ix. Persons engaged in any lawful activity during which wearing a mask or other face covering is prohibited by law.

(e) Enforcement; violations and penalties.

- a. The provisions of this section shall be in effect until modified by the governing body by repeal or extension.
- b. The police chief or his or her designated agent shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of this article within the City of Winfield. It shall be unlawful for

any person, firm, business, corporation, or organization subject to regulation under this section to fail to comply with all of its provisions. Any person or entity who violates any provision of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by:

- i. A fine not exceeding \$25.00 for the first violation.
- ii. A fine not exceeding \$50.00 for a second violation.
- iii. A fine not exceeding \$100.00 for each additional violation.
- c. Not applicable to Strother Field. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the Strother Field Airport and Industrial Park.

<u>Section 2.</u> This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication in the official city newspaper.

Analysis:

The City solicited quotes for a Rear Load Packer Body on a Crane Carrier Chassis in June of 2020. We requested four options for the purchase. A cash price, a cash price less trade-in, a lease option, and a lease option with trade-in. We evaluated the two proposes which were very close on the cash price less trade-in with Elliott Equipment submitting a quote of \$230,943.00 and Armor Equipment submitting a quote of \$231,407.00.

Fiscal Impact:

The purchase was planned in the budget Vehicle and Equipment replacement plan for 2020 at a value of \$250,000. The current plan for funding the purchase would be to utilize a portion of the equipment reserve fund with the remaining balance financed locally.

Action Requested: Consideration of retaining a contractor to directional bore both, sanitary sewer and water line under the highway (E. 9th Ave.)

Analysis: The City of Winfield is partnering with the state in the major improvement project on E. 9th Avenue from College St. to Wheat Rd. The city utilities department is recommending replacing the 8" Sanitary Sewer Line and the 8" Water line that cross 9th Street at Mound and Alexander. Currently the gas utility has been previously replaced in that area and can remain in its current form. The underground utility supervisor did request proposals from three companies. At the time of preparing the RFCA, we have not received all three proposals. The analysis of the proposals will be provided at the Work Session as well as staff recommendation.

Fiscal Impact: The City has budgeted funds for the completion of this project, not anticipating it to exceed \$50,000 total cost.

Ditch Diggers recently completed the bore under the Walnut River located at the fairgrounds, under budget and in a timely manner, staff was satisfied with their performance.

City staff is recommending Ditch Diggers be awarded this project, based on their submission of \$36,099.00. At the commission meeting on Monday, July 6, 2020.
