Winfield, Kansas October 17, 2022

The Board of City Commissioners met in regular session, Monday, October 17, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Commission-Community Council Meeting Room, City Hall; Mayor Ronald E. Hutto presiding. Commissioners Brenda K. Butters and Gregory N. Thompson were also present. Also in attendance were Taggart Wall, City Manager; Tania Richardson, City Clerk; and William E. Muret, City Attorney. Other staff members present were Patrick Steward, Director of Public Improvements; and Robbie DeLong, Police Chief.

Director of Public Improvements Steward explains the estimated project cost in \$263,338 with a Federal TA award of \$210,670 (80%) and local project share of \$52,668 (20%). Requestor: Taggart Wall

Action Requested: Consideration of approval of an easement for the installation of fiber utilities across the south edge of Cherry Street Park.

Analysis: As part of the ongoing project to extend fiber to City facilities and other locations, Kansas Fiber Network has requested an easement to allow the installation of the utility along the south edge of Cherry Street Park.

While typically installed in right-of-way—and at times next to or amongst other utilities including those of the City of Winfield—the installation within/across City property is not a frequent occurrence and requires an easement.

Kansas Fiber Network is also under a Franchise Agreement which speaks to right-of-way and other real property of the City including improvements to a Network—at locations to be filed and identified through the City permit process. That agreement sets forth parameters related to the interference with current or future work proposed by the City and the need for the KFN improvements to be removed or relocated at such time—at their sole cost.

Staff recommends approval.

WHEREAS, it was necessary to grant a certain permanent easement to provide right-of-way for installation, construction, maintenance, repair, and removal of the utilities and the necessary appurtenances in Cowley County, Kansas.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WINFIELD, KANSAS, THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Mayor and Clerk of the City of Winfield, Kansas, are hereby authorized and directed to grant a certain permanent easement in Cowley County, Kansas, necessary to provide right-of-way for the purpose of installation, construction, maintenance, repair, and removal of the utilities and the necessary appurtenances therefore, in, over, under, and across the real estate described as follows:

Beginning at a point 300 feet East of the intersection of the North line of the right of way of the Missouri Pacific Railroad and the West line of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 32 South, Range 4 East; thence East along the said railroad right of way to the East line of the Southwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 32 South, Range 4 East; Then north along the East line of the Southwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 32 South, Range 4 East to the South right of way line of E 15th Ave; thence West 10 feet parallel to the E 15th Ave right of way; thence South parallel to the East line of the Southwest Quarter of section 27, Township 32 South, Range 4 East to a point 10' North of the Missouri Pacific Railroad right of way; thence West parallel to the said railroad right of way to the East right of way line of Cherry St; thence South to the point of beginning.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Clerk of the City of Winfield, Kansas shall record said easement with the Register of Deeds of Cowley County, Kansas.

<u>Section 3.</u> This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

PERMANENT EASEMENT



The amount of money as set forth herein is in full payment for the use of said property and the undersigned releases the grantee from any claims for damages for acts or omissions pertaining to the purpose as set forth herein except for negligence on the part of said grantee. There are no other agreements, oral or written, between the parties except as set forth herein.

This easement is binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, trustees, and assigns of the parties hereto.

Request for Commission Action

Date: November 3, 2022

Requestor: Beau Bailey and Gus Collins

Action Requested: Consideration of approval for three sanitary sewer project that will serve the new Southwestern dorm and replace certain portions of the sewer in the Southwestern College campus.

Analysis: During the early planning stages of the construction of a new dormitory, it was determined the existing sanitary sewer service serving the student center needed to be relocated in order to construct the new facility. A main line extension down Warren Street was found to be the most practical solution. SWC has agreed to pay %100 of the cost.

This relocation as well as the additional housing units in the area raised concerns as to the capability of the existing infrastructure handling the additional flow. Staff recommendation is to increase the size of the downstream main lines to accommodate. SWC has agreed to share in this cost.

Project 1. Is an 8" sanitary sewer extension of approximately 350' to allow for the relocation of the existing sanitary sewer service (paid for by SWC).

Project 2. Is the replacement of approximately 1060' of 6" VCP with 8" PVC to accommodate the increased flow due to project #1 (paid for by city).

Project 3. Is the replacement of approximately 500' of 6" VCP with 8" PVC to accommodate the increased flow resulting from construction of the new dormitory (cost shared between SWC and the city).

Proposals were solicited from four contractors with only two submitting bids.

Nowak Construction- \$449,616.00 Tri-Star Utilities- \$285.560.00

Recommendation is to proceed with Tri-Star Utilities.

Fiscal Impact: SWC has agreed to a total cost share of \$150,000.00. City of Winfield responsibility is \$135,460 to be paid for with Capital Improvements Infrastructure funds budgeted for 2022.
