CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION
OF DRAIN IN DISTRICT NO. 214

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 25 day of Oct., 1948, by and between the Board of Supervisors of Wright County, Iowa, acting for Drainage District No. 214, Wright County, Iowa, party of the first part, and Kooiker Bros. Hull, Iowa, parties of the second part, WITNESSETH:--

Parties of the second part in consideration of the covenants of the first party, hereby covenants and agrees that it will in a good workmanlike manner at its own expense furnish and pay for all labor and material and perform all the work necessary for the construction of the drains of said district above named, in all respects and in accordance with the specifications, maps and profiles, relating to said work now on file in the office of the County Auditor of Wright County, Iowa, and in compliance with the notice to bidders and the proposal of the second party and will complete the same within the time fixed by the notice to bidders and proposal of the second parties, which notice to bidders and proposal are hereby expressly made a part of this contract.

It is further expressly understood and agreed that the maps, profiles, blue prints and specifications now filed in said drainage matter with the County Auditor are hereby made a part of this contract.

Parties of the second part hereby covenant to do said work as per their proposal hereto attached and made a part hereof.

First party shall not be responsible for delays, loss, or damages not directly caused by the express official order of said party of the first part made after the execution hereof, nor for the acts or omissions of any contractor or of any person or persons in the employ of first party.

Second party shall cause no unnecessary inconvenience or damage to the property owners in carrying on said work and shall deposit all material removed as prescribed by the plans and specifications and proposals, and second party shall be liable to all land-owners for damages sustained by them by reason of the failure of second party to exercise reasonable care in doing the work under this contract.

If it shall become apparent to the engineer in charge of the work that the dimensions of the ditch or drain should be enlarged deepened or otherwise changed for the better service of the land benefited, the party of the first part may authorize such change in the dimensions of the said improvement, and the parties of the second part, shall, if such change require additional excavation, undertake to perform such additional excavation and construction so authorized by the party of the first part at the same terms and pro rata price as hereinbefore provided.

If the second party shall in the opinion of the engineer fail to prosecute the work satisfactorily, or shall in the opinion of the engineer fail or refuse to prosecute the work after commencing the same, and damage to the ditch or district or land-owner therein results therefrom, the second party shall be liable therefor, and the first party may recover such damages by an action on the bond of the second party; or the said party of the first part may retain from the amount otherwise due the party of the second part, from time to time, such sum as shall reimburse the party of the first part for such damage, or enable them to repair the same, which amounts may be retained from the eighty per cent, (80 per cent) or the twenty per cent (20 per cent) or both.

In case the party of the second part shall abandon the work or fail to make satisfactory progress on said work, said ^{first} party may cause said work to be completed, and the parties of the second part, and also the sureties on the bond herein referred to, shall be jointly and severally liable to the party of the first part for any and all loss or damage resulting from such default, either from the greater expense of so completing said work, or from any other cause.

The party of the second part shall, at its own expense, remove all obstructions and do all clearing and grubbing necessary for carrying on the prescribed work. Under no circumstance will the party of the second part be allowed any pay for work or excavation not embraced within the terms of this agreement.

It is further agreed by the said parties of the second part that it will give its personal attention to the faithful prosecution of the said work, and will not assign or sub-let the same or any part thereof without the previous written consent of the ^{parties of} first part, subject to such conditions for its own protection, it may see fit to impose.

The party of the first part may stop the work or revoke this contract, or both, if the party of the second part or its employees shall willfully refuse to comply with any of the terms and requirements hereof, in which event the party of the second part shall forfeit to the party of the first part all payments due or to become due on said work as liquidated damages, for such breach of contract, and shall be liable for any further damages by reason thereof, and the party of the first part shall be in no manner liable for so stopping the work or revoking the contract.

The party of the second part shall keep drain constructed by it in good condition and repair at its own expense until the same is finally accepted by the party of the first part. The party of the second part covenants to complete said work to the entire satisfaction of the first party. Party of the second part shall be liable for all damages occasioned by the negligence or incompetency of its agents or servants, and agrees to pay the same.

It is further understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that

where said proposed improvement herein shall cross or run along any public highway, street, avenue, alley or public thoroughfare, the second party shall take all precautions to prevent accidents occurring to the public and shall protect all excavations with proper signals and warnings; second party to be responsible for and pay all damages resulting from its negligence in failing to so guard said work, either in a public highway or anywhere else along the course of the said proposed improvement. The contractor hereby binds himself to properly police the work and maintain signal lights at night where necessary in the judgment of the Construction Engineer and to properly protect the public and all railroad employees from danger on account of the construction of this drainage improvement through and across any railroad's right-of-way, and agrees to pay all damages resulting from its failure so to do.

All fences and all highway bridges and culverts necessary to be removed shall be removed by second party and piled in a manner and place suitable for their replacement and he shall replace same within thirty (30) days after completion of work through each forty (40) acre tract of land.

It is further agreed that the second party shall pay all bills and claims for labor or material before the same may become delinquent or be filed with the County Auditor as provided by law.

The contractor shall carry and keep in force during the life of this contract liability insurance for the protection of workmen employed in carrying out the work of this contract, the policy to be filed with the County Auditor, and a failure so to do will authorize the immediate revocation of this contract.

It is further agreed that this contract is executed under the terms of and is to be construed according to the provisions of the laws of Iowa as contained in Chapter 68 of the Acts of the 30th General Assembly and all laws amendatory thereof or additional thereto and that all payments herein agreed to be made shall be made at the time or times and in the form and manner as thereby provided, but first party may at any time retain from the eighty per cent (80 per cent) any amount necessary to protect itself from loss or damage by reason of any failure upon the part of the second party to comply with this contract, and in the event that second party does fail to comply, the first party shall not be entirely released to a recovery on the bond, but may retain any sums in its possession either of the eighty per cent (80 per cent) or the twenty per cent (20 per cent) to reimburse itself for damages sustained or to be sustained.

Should there be any difficulty between the parties hereto as to the construction of any of the terms or provisions of this agreement, including the plans and specifications hereinbefore made a part hereof, relating to the work to be done, such differences shall be referred to the engineer employed by the parties of the first part in charge of the work, and his decision shall be final and binding upon both parties.

The faithful performance of the terms of this contract by the party of the second part is further secured by bond.

A failure on the part of the contractor to keep his bond in full force and effect pending the performance of this contract shall entitle the first party to cancel the contract and first party may re-let the uncompleted portion of the work and recover the expense of completing the same from second party and his bondsmen.

It is further agreed that the Board of Supervisors may extend the time of the completion of this contract from time to time so often as it deems it advisable, without any notice to the surety on such bond.

TO DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 214, WRIGHT COUNTY, IOWA, AS PETITIONED BY MR. SAM
AMOSSON.

HISTORY

THE WATERSHED ENCOMPASSED BY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 214 WAS ORIGINALLY PROVIDED
WITH ARTIFICIAL DRAINAGE BY LATERAL "A" OF LATERAL NO. 1 OF DRAINAGE DISTRICT
NO. 107 WHICH WAS A TILE SYSTEM AS SHOWN ON THE ACCOMPANYING PLAT. DRAINAGE
DISTRICT NO. 214 IS A SURFACE DRAIN WHICH GENERALLY IS PARALLEL AND IS ON TOP OF
THE LAT. "A" TILE. BETWEEN THE COMPLETION OF THE LAT. "A" TILE AND THE
ESTABLISHMENT OF D. D. #214 A TILE WAS EXTENDED WEST FROM LAT. "A" TO SERVE
THE NE 1/4 OF SEC. 26-93-26.

DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 214 WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1948, CONTAINS 857 ACRES AND THE ORIGINAL ASSESSMENT WAS \$4371.77.

ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION

SINCE BOTH THE TILE SYSTEM AND THE SURFACE DRAIN SERVE THE AREA, BOTH WERE INVESTIGATED.

THE ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION OF THE TILE LINE CONSISTED OF THE FOLLOWING:

1500 LIN. FT.	16 INCH D.T.	0.1% GRADE
2700 LIN. FT.	15 INCH D.T.	0.1% GRADE
1800 LIN. FT.	14 INCH D.T.	0.1% GRADE

A 10 INCH AND 8 INCH TILE WAS EXTENDED WEST 2570 FT. WEST TO SERVE THE NE 1/4 OF SECTION 26. THE GRADE IS BELIEVED TO BE CONSTANT AND 0.2%.

THE SURFACE DRAIN CONSTRUCTED WAS ALONG AND ABOVE THE TILE AND HAD A BOTTOM WIDTH OF 10 FEET AND SIDE SLOPES OF 10:1. IT WAS CONSTRUCTED OVER ALL OF LATERAL "A" AND EXTENDED WEST TO SEC. 26-93-26.

THE CAPACITY OF THE EXISTING TILE IS AS FOLLOWS:

THE EXISTING TILE IS IN A POOR STATE OF REPAIR, THERE BEING NUMEROUS HOLES AND BLOW-OUTS. SEVEREST AMONG THESE BLOW-OUTS OCCURED AT STA. 7+72 AND 13+40 WHERE A NUMBER OF TILE HAVE BEEN DESTROYED. THIS IS UNDOUBTEDLY CAUSED BECAUSE THE TILE IS QUITE CLOSE TO THE BOTTOM OF THE SURFACE DRAIN.

THE SURFACE DRAIN HAS SILTED FROM 1.0' - 1.5' AND IN SOME AREAS NO LONGER EXISTS, PARTICULARLY IN THE S 1/2 OF THE NW 1/4, SEC. 25-93-26. IN OTHER PLACES IT IS BEING FARMED THROUGH.

EXISTING CONDITIONS

MOST ALL AREAS IN THE DISTRICT ARE SUFFERING FROM LACK OF DRAINAGE FACILITIES. EVIDENCE OF SUCH DAMAGE EXISTS ON MOST EVERY FARM AND IS PARTICULARLY SEVERE IN SEC. 26 AND IN THE SW 1/4 OF SEC. 25-93-26.

WHEN THE EXISTING TILE WAS CONSTRUCTED IT SHOULD HAVE BEEN DESIGNED ON THE BASIS OF REMOVING 1/4 INCH/24 HRS. FROM THE WATERSHED. UNFORTUNATELY IT WAS NOT. IT IS ONLY CAPABLE OF ABOUT 15%-20% OF THIS, CONSEQUENTLY, IS FAR UNDER THE REQUIRED CAPACITY. IN THE PAST 20 YEARS TILE SYSTEMS HAVE BEEN DESIGNED ON A 1/2 INCH/24 HR. REMOVAL RATE BECAUSE THIS IS NOW JUSTIFIED AND NEEDED BY CURRENT AGRICULTURAL METHODS, CROP YIELDS AND LAND PRICES. IT IS OBVIOUS THAT MANY OF THE PROBLEMS IN THE DISTRICT ARE CAUSED OR ARE A RESULT OF THIS INADEQUATE DRAINAGE.

METHODS OF RELIEF

THE PETITIONER ASKED THAT THE DRAINAGE DISTRICT No. 214 BE RESTORED TO ITS ORIGINAL EFFICIENCY AND CAPACITY. IT HAS ALSO BEEN REQUESTED THAT THE LOWER 1500 FT. BE CONVERTED TO AN OPEN DITCH.

OUR EXPERIENCE WITH THIS TYPE OF A SURFACE DRAIN HAS BEEN POOR WHERE THE DRAIN TRAVERSES MORE THAN ONE PROPERTY OWNER. NORMALLY THE RESULT IS, AS IT HAS BEEN IN THIS DISTRICT, THAT THE SURFACE DRAIN CEASES TO FUNCTION BECAUSE OF LACK OF CARE. IF THEY ARE TO WORK AS INTENDED THEY REQUIRE ALMOST CONSTANT MAINTENANCE.

THEY ALSO RESULT IN THE LAND OWNERS HAVING ALL THE DISADVANTAGES OF AN OPEN DITCH AND NONE OF THE ADVANTAGES.

THERE ARE THREE POSSIBILITIES FOR PROVIDING THE NEEDED RELIEF TO THE DISTRICT. AN OPEN DITCH OR A RELIEF TILE OR A COMBINATION OF THE TWO.

A REPAIR OF DRAINAGE DISTRICT No. 214 WOULD MERELY "CLEAN-OUT" THE SURFACE DRAIN AND THIS IS QUITE LIMITED BECAUSE OF THE SHALLOWSNESS OF THE TILE, CONSEQUENTLY WOULD NOT PROVIDE RELIABLE RELIEF.

IT APPEARS THAT THE MOST FEASIBLE METHOD OF PROVIDING THE NECESSARY RELIEF IS THROUGH A COMBINATION OF AN OPEN DITCH AND RELIEF TILE. THERE ARE MANY WAYS OR PLACES THEY CAN BE COMBINED BUT THE BEST WOULD BE TO CONVERT THE SURFACE DRAIN INTO AN OPEN DITCH TO STA. 45+00 (W 1/4 COR. OF NE 1/4 OF SEC. 25-93-26) AND THEN EXTEND RELIEF TILE TO THE SOUTH AND WEST. A PORTION OF THE OPEN DITCH STA. 14+50 (ROAD) TO STA. 45+00 COULD BE REPLACED BY A RELIEF TILE IF THIS WAS PREFERRED BY THE LAND OWNERS.

RECOMMENDED IMPROVEMENTS

SINCE VARIOUS POSSIBILITIES EXISTS WE ARE RECOMMENDING TWO PLANS, EITHER WHICH COULD BE ACCEPTED BY THE BOARD IN FULL OR IN PART.

PLAN 1

- A. CONSTRUCT AN OPEN DITCH TO STA. 45+00. SAID OPEN DITCH TO HAVE A SIX (6') FOOT WIDE BOTTOM WITH 2:1 SIDE SLOPES AND SUFFICIENT DEPTH TO PROVIDE AN OUTLET FOR THE TRIBUTARY LANDS.

PROJECT-SURFACE DRAIN REPAIR

October 18, 1984

DD 214

I. Size and Location:

DD 214 contains 857 acres and lies in Sections 24, 25, & 26 in Boone Township and in Sections 19 and 30 in Norway Township, Wright County, Iowa. It begins as an open ditch which empties into Lateral No. 1 of DD 107 approximately 1200 ft E. of the N.E. corner of Section 25-93-26 and continues south-westerly 1600 ft to the road on the E. line of said Section 25. From that point, which is the beginning of the project with which we are concerned, it continues on as a 'surface drain' South and West 5700 ft, crossing the road on the W. line of said Section 25 approximately 1650 ft S. of the N.W. corner of said Section 25. Lateral 1 connects to this main ditch on the N. line of the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 25 and extends approximately 1350 ft south-westerly.

II. History:

DD 214 was established in 1948 to construct a surface drain to supplement sub surface tile drainage previously constructed as a part of DD 107. Those tile lines are shown on the accompanying plat and their respective sizes and approximate locations are indicated. The original cost to construct DD 214 was \$4,371.00. The original ditch had a cross section with a 10 ft bottom and 10 to 1 side slopes. No profile of the ditch flow line is available, but it was apparently quite shallow, and had, by 1969 became silted and ineffective.

In 1969 a petition was filed asking that action be taken to improve drainage in the district. Jon McClure was appointed as engineer; in his report he made several observations and recommendations. He acknowledged the fact of inadequate drainage and offered two alternative proposals, both of which provided for supplemental subsurface (tile) drainage and enlarging and deepening of existing surface drains.

It was decided that no additional tile lines would be constructed, but that the existing surface drains would be deepened and enlarged. In 1971 a contract was let to do the work on the main for \$14,335.00, and to repair Lateral 1, for \$915.00. Thus the total expense to this time on DD 214 is \$4,371.00 + 14,335.00 + 915.00 = \$19,621.00.

III. Present Condition:

The first 3400 ft of that portion of the ditch with which we are concerned (beginning at the road on the E. line of Section 25) was designed with a flow line of 0.1% grade; the remaining 2800 ft of the ditch to the west-southwest was designed on a 0.2% grade. The side slopes of the main ditch are approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3/1 and the bottom varies from 30 ft at the E. end to 8 ft at the west. Lateral 1 was designed on a 0.1% grade, and has a 5 - 6 ft bottom and 2/1 side slopes.

The flow line has filled in as much as $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft in some places; mainly downstream from the grade change (Sta 34-10), at the property line fence between the E $\frac{1}{2}$ & W $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 25, and near the east road. The sides have slumped but seem stable and are well covered with brome grass. Some brush and small cottonwood trees have begun to grow in the ditch.

IV. Recommendations:

As was indicated in the 1971 Engineer's report, subsurface drainage for the district is inadequate. The 16 inch tile outlet provided under DD 107 will, by present standards, drain about 150 acres. A supplemental 24 in. tile would be called for. But the decision was made in 1971, to continue with a surface drain. It is my understanding that we should concern ourselves with the reconstruction of that drain. If requested, we will investigate the option of additional tile lines.

Firstly the brush and trees should be cleared out of the ditch. Since the trees are small, a lump sum bid, rather than a unit price for clearing and grubbing is contemplated. Prospective bidders should inspect the site.

Secondly, the ditch bottom should be returned at least to its original grade. This would require approximately 4500 C.Y. of excavation. Lateral 1 should also be excavated to original grade (approximately 300 C.Y.).

A second alternative to returning to 'original grade' might be considered. Since some silting has occurred where the flow line changes grade, and since a 0.1% grade is considered minimal for adequate drainage, and is difficult to construct and maintain, the culvert at the road at the beginning of the project might be lowered 1.7 ft, this would allow a flow line grade of 0.15% to station 34 where it changes to 0.2%. This might result in better drainage with less maintainance. An alternate cost estimate follows. To permit a 0.2% grade on the entire ditch, the culvert would need to be lowered 3.4 ft. This would be possible, but more expensive. The entire 130 ft culvert would need to be removed, excavated and replaced. More excavation on the E. end of the ditch would add to the cost.

Spoil banks should be graded back on a 10/1 slope. The fence on the south bank of the ditch through the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 25 will probably need to be removed, and perhaps replaced. It might be possible to cast the dirt all on the north side. A bid item for fence removal and replacement is contemplated.

Since the banks have settled, the present side slopes are flatter than designed. Since they are well seeded and stable, care should be taken, where possible to preserve their integrity. New excavation should be seeded immediately upon completion.

V. Easement:

The 1971 Engineer's report stated that adequate easements had been acquired at the time of the inception of DD 214. No record of this easement was found. If a legal description for easement is required, one will be provided.
